

Know all men by these presents that we Gabriel Adams jun<sup>r</sup> Governor  
of the Province of New Hampshire and Francis Good and wife of firmly bound unto William Fairfax Esq<sup>r</sup>  
the first Justice in the Commission of the peace for Fairfax County for and  
in behalf of the said use and behoof of the Justices of the said County &  
their Successors in the sum of four hundred pounds Sterling to be paid for  
said William Fairfax his Executors adm<sup>r</sup> & Assignes to the which payment  
well & truly to be made We bind ourselves & every of us our exors of ours  
heirs Executors adm<sup>r</sup> jointly and severally firmly by these presents sealed  
with our Seals dated this 19<sup>th</sup> day of May 1743.

The Condition of this obligation is such that if the above bound Gabriel  
Adams jun<sup>r</sup> adm<sup>r</sup> of all the goods Chattels & Credits of John Lloyd dec<sup>d</sup> do  
make or cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all & singular the goods  
Chattels & Credits of the said dec<sup>d</sup> which have or shall come to the hands or  
possession or knowledge of the said Gabriel Adams jun<sup>r</sup> or into the hands or  
possession of any other person or persons for him & the same do exhibit or  
cause to be exhibited into the County Court of Fairfax at such time as he  
shall be thereto required by the said Court & the same goods Chattels &  
Credits & all other the goods Chattels & Credits of the said Dec<sup>d</sup> at the time  
of his death which at any time after shall come to the hands or  
possession of the said Gabriel Adams jun<sup>r</sup> or into the hands or possession  
of any other person or persons for him do well & truly administer  
according to Law & further do make a just & true account of his actings &  
things therein when thereto required by the said Court & all the rest and  
Residue of the said Goods Chattels & Credits which shall be found remaining  
upon the said adm<sup>r</sup> accounts the same being first Examined & allowed by  
the Justices of the Court for the time being shall Deliver and pay unto  
such person or persons respectively as the said Justices by their order or  
Warrant shall direct pursuant to the Laws in that case made & provided  
and if it shall hereafter appear that any last Will & Testament was  
made by the said dec<sup>d</sup> & the Ex<sup>r</sup> or Ex<sup>cs</sup> therein named do exhibit the same  
into the said Court making request to have it allowed and approved according  
ly if the said Gabriel Adams jun<sup>r</sup> being therunto required do render and  
Deliver up his Letters of Administrations approbations of such Testament  
being first read & made in the said Court then this obligation to be void

or else to remain, in full force & Virtue.

Fairfax being weak of body sound of mind more grown & advanced praised be God for  
the same doke with my ordaine & appoint this to be my last will & Testament revoking  
canceling all former wills & Testaments formerly made by me & ordaining this to  
be my last will & Testament in manner & form following as first I give the and  
bequeath my Soul to the hands of almighty God my heavenly father hoping that  
through the merits & satisfaction of Jesus Christ my Lord & savior to receive  
pardon & forgiveness of all my sins & to obtain a joyfull resurrection at  
the last day & as for my body to be buried at the discretion of my next of kin as for  
the same be it so.

How I give and bequeath to my son Richard Kirkland all my right title and  
claim which I have to a tract of Land containing four hundred acres of Land  
being known by the name of Browns former lying & being in Baltimore  
County

I have given and bequeath to my well beloved wife Mary the plantation on  
 which I now live call the Land belonging therunto during the term of her  
 natural life & after her decease to my Son Robert Kirkland & his heirs for  
 ever my Son Robert Kirkland paying my Son John Kirkland ten pounds  
 current money of Virginia.

Then all my moveable estate I give and bequeath to my well beloved wife Mary during the term of her natural life after her decease to be equally divided amongst all my Sons & Daughters.

Now I appoint my well beloved wife Mary & George Hubbard to carry E<sup>d</sup> of  
this my Last Will & Testament.
