I John Martin of Turov in the County of Fairfax planter being very sick & weak in body but of perfect mind & memory thanks be given unto God for the same and calling to mind the Mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make & ordain this my last will & Testament: That is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it. And for my body I recommend it to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner at the direction of my Executors nothing doubting but at the General resurrection shall receive the same again by the mighty Power of God. And as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life, I give devise and dispose of the same in manner & form following that is to say in the first place I give and bequeath to my well beloved son James Martin one hundred acres of land he know lives upon also I gave my well beloved son John Martin one hundred acres of land he know lives on, and likewise to my son George Martin one hundred acres with his dwelling plantation he know lives on and to my son Joseph Martin I gave my dwelling plantation with one hundred acres of land and if he should die without an acre lawfully begotten of his body then his part to be divided & between the other three. The movables I leave to my wife Mary during her widow hood and at her decease to be equally divided between my son Joseph & my daughter Isabel Rectifying & Confirming this and no other to be my last will & Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the day & year above written.
