 being very sick and weak of body but of perfect mind and memory thanks to God for it do
 remane & abint this my last will & Testament in the manner & form following first I give
 my soul to God that gave it me and my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my
 executors hereafter mentioned as they shall think fit Item my will and desire is that my tract
 of land in Fairfax County to be equally divided between my two sons Anthony Raines
 and John Raines Item I give to my son Anthony Raines a young black mare about
 two years old Item I give to my son John Raines a young heifer about two years old
 Item my will and desire is that John Bransham take my two sons Anthony Raines &
 John Raines and give schooling to them and bind them to a good trades as he shall think
 fit my will and desire is that my two sons Anthony Raines and John Raines stay at
 the trade till they are twenty years of age each and that the said John Bransham is to give
 Anthony Raines a mares bridle and Sadel at the age of twenty years and also to give
 John Raines a Cow and calf at the same age Item I leave my dearly beloved wife Mary a
 Raines and Henry Suttle my executors of my Last will and Testament Item my will and
 desire

now is that my personal estate to be equally divided between my beloved wife Anna & ⁽⁸⁵⁾
Diana and my two sons she has by me Newman Barnes and Sally Barnes and the
child she goes with now and if either of them should die without issue that then
to be equally divided between his youngest children that he had by his last wife -
Anna Barnes Item my will and desire is that my wife Anna Barnes have her-
widow man over and have her equal part of the other estate Without my hand and
seal this ¹⁹ day of September 1785.

In the name of God amen this ninth day of April one thousand seven hundred &
fifty three I John Trammell being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind -
and memory thanks be given to God therefore calling to mind the mortality of my
body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and re-
cord this my last will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all
I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it me and
my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent and Christian like manner
at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I
shall receive again by the mighty power of God: and as touching such worldly estate
wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give and dispose of the same
in the following manner and form Item I give and bequeath to my son
William Trammell six thousand pounds of Crops Tobacco and five hundred pounds of
pork to be paid by my executors within eighteen months after my decease Item
