Executors hereafter mentioned as they shall think fit. Item my will and desire is that my tract
of land in Surfax County to be equally divided between my two sons Anthony Raines
and John Raines. Item I give to my son Anthony Raines a young black Negro about
two years old Item I give to my son John Raines a young heifer about two years old
Item my will and desire is that John Dransham take my two sons Anthony Raines &
John Raines and give schooling to them and bind them to a good trade as he shall think
fit. my will and desire is that my two sons Anthony Raines and John Raines stay at
the trade till they are twenty years of age each and that the said John Dransham is to give
Anthony Raines a mare bridle and Sadel at the age of twenty years and also to give
John Raines a Cow and calf at the same age Item I love my daily beloved wife Reza
Raines and Henry settle my Executors of my Last will and Testament. Item my will and

and is that my personal estate to be equally divided between my beloved wife Anna & (25)
Francis and my two sons who bore by me Nathaniel Francis and Dolly Francis and the
child she gave with now and if either of them should die without issue that there
