

In the name of God Amen I John Turley of Fincroft Parish in the County of Hampshire  
rich and worth but thanks to God & my perfect understanding and being willing  
and desirous to settle my worldly affairs in such manner as may prevent disputes and  
Contentions after my death do make and ordain this to be my last Will & Testament in  
manner and form following. First I give and bequeath my soul to God nothing  
doubting but hoping through the Merit and Mediation of my Saviour & redeemer to  
have a Joyfull resurrection. And as to my worldly estate I give and dispose of the  
same in the following manner.

I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Jane Turley one riding horse called Romeo  
for her own proper use & benefit for ever.

I give and bequeath unto my said wife Jane the use benefit and labours of the five  
following slaves namely Sue, Lucy, Ned, Monetta & Judith to her proper use & benefit  
during her Natural life and after her decease to pass and go as is hereafter directed.

I likewise give unto my said wife Jane one half of my moveable estate to her proper  
use benefit & disposal forever, and the use of the other half of my moveable estate during  
her Natural life and after her death to pass and go as is hereafter directed.

I give and bequeath my horse called Cesar to Martha Turley the wife of my son John  
Turley to her use and benefit for ever.

I give and bequeath unto my Grand-Daughter Jane Turley the Daughter of Sampson &  
Turley and Martha his wife a tract of Land lying on the lower side of Popes head run  
in Fincroft Parish containing four hundred acres to her and the heirs of her body lawfully  
begotten and in default of such heirs lawfully begotten my will is that the aforesaid four  
hundred acres of land be equally divided between my Grand-Daughter Henrietta &  
Turley and my Grand-Daughter Martha Turley as equal in quantity & quality as  
possible may be to them and the heirs of their bodies lawfully begotten and in default  
of such heirs then to pass & go unto my Grandson John Turley him his heirs or assigns  
for ever.

I give and bequeath unto my Grandson Giles Turley my tract of land lying upon  
the South branch of the Broadrun of Potomack River near the mountain road to him  
the said Giles and the heirs of his body lawfully begotten for ever.

I give and bequeath unto my Grandson John Turley one negro Ladd called Monetta  
after the decease of his Grand-mother my wife to him & his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath unto my Grand-Daughter Jane Turley one negro girl named  
Judith after the death of her Grand-mother my wife as aforesaid to her the said

Jane and the heirs of his body lawfully begotten and in want of such heirs then to my  
Grandson John Turley him his heirs or assigns for ever - and my will is that if my wife  
Jane Turley depart this life before that my Grandson John Turley and my Grand Daughter  
Jane Turley arrive to age of Eighteen years that then my son Sampson Turley have the use &  
benefit of the said two negro's, that is to say the use of the negro Land Master given  
unto my Grandson John until the said John shall arrive to the age of twenty one years  
or the day of his marriage and no longer, and the use of the negro girl Judith given  
unto my Grand Daughter Jane until she arrive to the age of Eighteen years or her  
day of Marriage & no longer.

Whereas I have given my wife Jane one half of my moveable estate to her disposal  
in her and the use of the other half only during her Natural life my will is that after  
my wife's death the one half that I have only given her the use of be to the use and  
benefit of my son Sampson Turley him his heirs or assigns for ever.

I give and bequeath unto my son Sampson Turley after the decease of his mother my wife  
three Negroe namely Sue Lucy & Ned that is to say the use of the three slaves during  
his Natural life and the life of his wife Martha and the longest lives of them, after  
whose death the said Negroe and their future increase are to be divided equally between  
Jane John Hemmella Giles & Martha the sons and daughters of my son Sampson Turley  
and Martha his wife & to their heirs in equal parts & proportions.

The tract of land I now live on containing four hundred fifty and three acres I give unto my  
wife Jane to be quietly held Occupied and Enjoyed during her Natural life & after her  
decease I give the said land w<sup>t</sup> all & every its appurtenances to my son Sampson Turley  
during his Natural life and after his decease unto my Grandson John Turley and the  
heirs of his body lawfully begotten and in default of such heirs my will is that it go  
and descend to my Grandson Giles Turley to him his heirs or assigns forever.

I give unto my said son Sampson Turley my water Mill upon posies head run  
with all the benefits arising or accruing thereto from and during the term of his Natural  
life and after his decease I give the same to John the son of Sampson Turley his his heirs or  
assigns forever under this condition and promise that so long as his mother my wife  
shall desire she shall have always liberty to quire her ground at the said Mill free from  
any Taxe or charge for the same it being my will & desire it should be so.

I also give unto my son Sampson Turley all the estate right Title benefit & claim w<sup>t</sup> I  
now hold or may hold of and in one hundred and fifty acres of Land in Longmead run  
Leased from John Waugh to be by him the said Sampson Turley quietly held & Enjoyed  
according

according to the terms in the said clause mentioned & comprised

I give and bequeath unto my sister Elizabeth Simmone the wife of Thomas Simmone one thousand pounds of Tobacco after my just debts are paid to be paid the said Elizabeth at the direction of my Executors hereafter named in such sort manner & form as may be most for her benefit and advantage.

Lastly I nominate constitute ordain & appoint my loving wife Jane Turley and my loving son Sampson Turley my whole & sole Executrix of this my Last will & Testament revoking all others heretofore by me made. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & fixed my seal this eighth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and fifty six.
