all benefit by the said Will, on her motion and she having performed what is usual  
in such cases Certificate is granted her for obtaining Letters of Administration (with  
or) the will annexed in due form.

Testamentary Warrant.

In the name of God amen this ninth day of April one thousand seven hundred &  
fifty three I John Trammell being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind -  
and memory thanks be given to God therefore calling to mind the mortality of my  
body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and so  
ordain this my last will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all  
I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it me and  
my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent and Christian like manner  
at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I  
shall receive again by the mighty power of God: and as touching such worldly estate  
wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give and and dispose of the same  
in the following manner and form Item I give and bequeath to my son &  
William Trammell six thousand pounds of Crops Tobacco and five hundred pounds of  
pork to be paid by my executors within eighteen months after my decease Item

I give and bequeath to my daughter Lucy Stark four thousand pounds of Crop Tobacco  
 and one gold ring to be paid by my daughter within eighteen months after my decease - Item I give to my daughter Betty Frenchman one thousand pounds of Crop tobacco  
 and one gold ring to be paid by my daughter within eighteen months after my decease - Item I give to my daughter Lattice Oxford two thousand two hundred pounds of  
 Crop tobacco and three hundred weight of pork and one gold ring all the pork also  
 mentioned to be paid by my son Sampson Frammell all to be paid within eighteen  
 months after my decease - Item I give to my daughter Milliey Frammell her  
 choice young young negro named Tom p. Gepp to be left in the hands of her brother  
 Sampson Frammell till she marries to her and her heirs and assigns forever the said  
 Sampson is to pay her sixteen hundred pounds of Crop tobacco a year clear of all  
 charges during the time I also give her one gray Horse branded with T E and one  
 side saddle and bridle also two lemons and calces and one feather bed with fifty yards  
 good feathers and Doolster and two thousand pounds of Crop tobacco and all the  
 washing clothes she is present with and goats and ings and ten barrels of corn to  
 be paid by Sampson Frammell as she calls for it and she to live with her  
 brother Sampson if she chooses without paying any thing - Item I give to my  
 son Sampson Frammell two hundred and forty eight acres of land where Joseph  
 McCooley lives to him his heirs and assigns forever and also the land I had of  
 Maj. McCooley during the term of the said lease to him and his heirs and also  
 all my stock of Horses and all the corn and meat that is on my plantation and the  
 Crop of corn that is begun before my decease - Item I give to my son Sampson  
 Frammell one negro man named Jerry to him his heirs or assigns forever also  
 horses mares and colts except my riding horse I also give to my son Sampson  
 all my Carpenters and Coopers tools house bells ploughs hoes and axes belongs  
 to the plantation - Item I give to my son John Frammell two hundred and sixty four  
 acres of land purchased of John Harle lying on Pimmetts run to him his heirs and  
 assigns forever and also my best riding horse saddle and bridle and saddle bags  
 and still and Crop cut saw and six hoes and the rest of my Land and negroes to  
 be equally divided between my two sons John Frammell and Sampson Frammell  
 there is three negroes I am about to give in Virginian land if recovered to be equally divided

between them each of them having an equal part of the last it is my will that my two  
sons John Scammell and Sampson Scammell divide the residue by chusing one at a time  
Sampson having his first choice it is my desire that all debts and gains concerning the -  
late suit in Maryland be equally divided between them Item I leave my son  
John Scammell & Sampson Scammell <sup>my wife</sup> executors of this my last will and I do disown  
and revoke all other wills before made by me in witness whereof I have hereunto  
set my hand and seal -
