In the name of God amen this ninth day of April one thousand seven hundred &
fifty three I John Frammell being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind
and memory thanks be given to God therefore calling to mind the mortality of my
Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to Die do make and
ordain this my last will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all
I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it me and
my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent and Christian like manner
at the discretion of my Executors nothing Doubting but at the General resurrection I
shall receive again by the mighty power of God: and as touching such worldly estate
wherein it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give and dispose of the
same in the following manner and form. Item I give and bequeath to my son
William Frammell six thousand pounds of Crop Tobacco and five hundred pounds of
peach to be paid by my Executors within eighteen months after my decease. Item

I give and bequeath to my daughter Betty Clark four thousand pounds of Crop Tobacco and one gold ring to be paid by my daughter within eighteen months after my decease. Item I give to my daughter Betty Sheehman one thousand pounds of Crop Tobacco and one gold ring to be paid by my daughter within eighteen months after my decease. Item I give to my daughter Lettice Esford two thousand two hundred pounds of Crop Tobacco and three hundred weight of pork and one gold ring all the stock above mentioned to be paid by my son Sampson Frammell all to be paid within eighteen months after my decease. Item I give to my daughter William Frammell to choice young young negro named Tom & Peggy to be left in the hands of her brother Sampson Frammell till she marries to her and her heirs and assigns forever the said Sampson is to pay her sixteen hundred pounds of Crop Tobacco a year clear of all charges during the time I also give her one gray Horse branded with T F and one side saddle and bridle also two cows and calves and one feather bed with fifty weight good feathers and Bolsters and two thousand pounds of Crop Tobacco and all the wearing cloths she is possessed with and goods and things and ten barrells of Corn to be paid by Sampson Frammell as she calls for it and she to live with her brother Sampson if she chooses without paying any thing. Item I give to my son Sampson Frammell two hundred and sixty eight acres of Land where Joseph McCaley lives to him his heirs and assigns forever and also the land I lent of to May McCarty during the term of the said lease to him and his heirs and also all my stock of Hogs and all the corn and meet that is on my plantation and the Crop of Corn that is begun before my decease. Item I give to my son Sampson Frammell one negro man named Jemy to him his heirs or assigns forever also my horses mares and Colts except my riding horses. I also give to my son Sampson all my Carpenters and Coopers tools horse bells ploughs hoes and Acres belonging to the plantation. Item I give to my son John Frammell two hundred and sixty four acres of Land purchased of John Clarke lying on Rimmetts run to him his heirs and assigns forever, and also my best riding horse saddle and bridle and saddle bag and still and Crop cut saw and war hoes and the rest of my Land and negroes to be equally divided between my two sons John Frammell and Sampson Frammell. There is three negroes I am at law for in Maryland if recovered to be equally divided

between them each of them paying an equall part of the cost it is my will that my two
sons John Frammell and Sampson Frammell divide the negroes by choosing one at a time
Sampson having the first choice it is my desire that all debt and gain concerning the
said suit in Maryland be equallly divided between them. Item I leave my son
John Frammell & Sampson Frammell ^{my whole} Executors of this my Last will and Testam^t
and receive all other wills before made by me the witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal
