weak in body but of sound Memory (blessed be God) do this twenty sixth
day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and
fifty six make and publish this my Last will and Testament in the
manner and form following.

Item I give and bequeath to my son William Dulin ten pounds
Virginia Currency to be due to him on the day of my decease

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Lydia Holbert ten pounds of
said money and one thousand pounds of Tobacco

Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah Mife five pounds of
the said money

Item I give and bequeath to my son John Dulin one negro man named
Jack to him the said John and his heirs for ever

Item I give and bequeath to my son Edward Dulin my Young Mare
called Beauty as also my bridle and saddle

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Ann Beach one Negro
Grl named Fanny to her the said Mary Ann & her increase to her the
Mary Ann and her heirs for ever
