

In the Name of God Amen, I John Clark of the Parish of Truro, and County of Fairfax,
Being sick in Body but of a good and sound Memory and understanding Thank to be to God for it, and calling to
Mind the uncertainty of this Life, and that it is Ordained once for all Men to die when it Pleases God. I do claim and De-
clare this to be my Last Will and Testament, in manner and Form as Followeth, In the first place, I Commit my soul
into the Hands of a heavenly God, who gave it to me, and my Body to the ground from whence it was taken, to be Buried in a
Decent manner at the Discretion of my Executors, whom I shall Hereafter Mention, and as for my worldly Estate which I shall
Pleasant God be Brought and be to me with, I do Dispose of in manner and Form as Followeth, *Imprimis* I give unto my
Loving Wife Barbara Clark the use of all my whole Estate During her Natural Life except Two Negroes hereafter Mentioned,
and one Feather Bed which I give to my son John Clark immediately, and after his Mother's Decease I give and Bequeath the
same Estate unto my children whom I shall Mention as Followeth. *Item* I give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah
Pitcher one Negro girl named Sany and her Increase for ever, *Item* I give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Winney
Pitcher one Negro girl named Sany and her Increase for ever, *Item* I give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth Simpson,
one Negro girl named Nan and her Increase for ever, *Item* I give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Susanah Moore a
Negro girl named Fani and her Increase for ever, *Item* I give and Bequeath to my son John Clark Two Negroes one
named Pat and her Increase for ever, also a Negro Lad named Sam, and one Feather Bed which he is to Receive at my Death,
and at his Mother's Decease the Remains part of my Estate, that is to say all my House hold goods of all kind, and all
my Stock of Horses, Cattle, Sheep, and Hogs, and I do give my Slaves their, same as Followeth, old Nan, a young Harry
George, Ben, Lucy, Hannah, Thom and their Increase to him and her Children for ever. My further Will is that they shall
be no appraisement, or Security given in the Estate after my Decease and I do hereby Nominate and appoint my
Dearly Beloved Wife Barbara Clark my Executor, and also my Dear son John Clark Executor of this my Last Will
and Testament, and I do revoke and Revoke all former Wills by me made Herebefore and Declare this only to be my
Last Will and Testament, *In witness* whereof I have Hereunto set my Hand and Seal this 19th Day of
June 1772

perfect Senses do make and constitute and appoint this to be my Last Will and Testament, utterly revoking any Wills

Whereas I am Indebted to my Sister in Law Mary Saunders eighty pounds Virginia currency, my will and Desire
