Item I give and bequeath unto my loving daughter Hannah Johnston one negro girl named Lucy one feather bed and furniture and thirty pounds Virginia currency to be paid unto her whenever she demands it. I also give and bequeath unto my daughter Hannah Johnston a negro man named Toby after the death of my wife or at the end of her widowhood.

Item I give and bequeath unto my loving daughter Francis Cleveland a negro boy named Tom and after the death of my daughter I give the said negro boy Tom unto my grandson Johnston Cleveland I also give unto my daughter Francis Cleveland a negro girl named Kate after the death of my wife or at the end of her widowhood and half a dozen sheep to be delivered in April 1770. I also give unto my son in law James Cleveland eleven or twelve pounds current money which he borrowed from me.

Item I give and bequeath unto my loving daughter Pinner Simpson one negro boy named Daniel during her natural life and after her death I give the said negro boy unto my ^{grand}son Samuel Simpson.

Item I give and bequeath unto my loving daughter Ann Thompson one negro girl named Moll I also give unto my son in law Joseph Thompson his note of hand payable unto me for fifteen Pistoles. my desire is that the above negro girl Moll after the death of

Of my daughter Ann Thompson should descend unto my grandson Sam^l. Thompson.

Item I give unto my sons Sam^l. Johnston and John Johnston all my hoopern tools to be equally divided between them.

Item I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Hannah Johnston all the residue and remainder of my estate during her natural life provided she remain my widow to dispose discretionaly among my children. I also constitute and appoint my loving wife Hannah Johnston and my son Samuel Johnston Executors & Executor of this my last Will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this first day of May 1769.

In the name of God amen the 23^o day of May 1769. I John McIntosh of Fairfax County and Town of Colchester being sick and weak in body but of sound and perfect memory praise be God for the same Do make this my last Will and Testament. And first I do revoke and make void all Wills by me formerly made & declare and appoint this my last Will and Testament as follows Viz^t

I give and bequeath to my son Lochlin McIntosh and to his heirs forever my Lots and Houses in the Town of Colchester after my youngest daughter shall arrive to the age of eighteen years.

Item.

Item I give to my son John Mcintosh and to his heirs forever my old plantation where William McDonald now lives containing 93 Acres more or less after my youngest daughter shall arrive to the age of eighteen years.

Item I give to my son Thomas Mcintosh and to his heirs forever my new tract of Land with 100 Acres thereto belonging where old James McDaniel now lives after my youngest daughter shall arrive to the age of eighteen years. and if in case either of my sons die before the age of twenty one years my desire is that his part of the land be equally divided between my other two sons and in case either of them should die before he arrives to the age of twenty one years my desire is that the survivor shall enjoy the whole to him and his heirs and in case that all three should die before they come to age my desire is that the land be equally divided among my three daughters and their heirs forever.

Item, my Will and desire is that all the remaining part of my estate Real and personal shall be equally divided between my three daughters Catharine Ann & Alexander Mcintosh when the youngest shall come to age. but that my wife shall have the management of the whole during that time in order to support the young children and bring them up as shall think proper and if she think proper she may sell any part of my personal Estate to support the children or to pay my debts untill my youngest daughter shall arrive to the age of eighteen years I do hereby appoint my wife Elizabeth Mcintosh and Locklin Mcintosh my whole and sole Executors.
