In the name of God, Amen. August 29<sup>th</sup> 1774

I Thomas Ford of Fairfax County and Colony of Virginia being weak of body but perfect in memory, thanks be to almighty God for it. Do appoint constitute and ordain this to my last Will and Testament revoking all Will or Wills heretofore by me made and this to stand and remain first I give and bequeath my Soul to almighty God that gave it and my body to the dust to be buried in such decent Order as my Executors shall think fit.

Item first my Will and desire is that all my just Debts may be fully satisfied and paid

Item first I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Jane Ford the use of the Plantation whereon I now live and all the Land lying Between the long branch, and the Little branch branch not not in the purty of Joseph Woods Lease during her natural Life or widowhood. I also give the use of two Slaves to her during her natural life or widowhood and after her decease or marriage for the Slaves to be sold at six or twelve months Credit as the Executors shall think most proper having bond and Security of the purchasers and the money arising from such sale to be equally divided among my four daughters vid Ann, Elizabeth Ford the widow of William King and Ann Ford the wife of John Dorey and Mary Ford the wife of John Simpson and Priscilla Ford the wife of Josiah Ferguson.

Item I give and bequeath to my well beloved son John Ford one half of the said Ingsbee at the  
termin of the tract whereon I now live to him & his heirs for ever

Item the other half of the Land I give and bequeath unto my well beloved Son Edward Ford at the upper end of the tract where James Moore now lives to him this half for ever

Item I give unto my well beloved daughter Katy Ford the wife of John Simpson one feather  
bed furniture and one Cow & Calf

Item I give unto my daughter Sarah (now the wife of Thomas Jacobs) five hundred current money to be made out of my Estate.

Item I give unto my Grand Daughter Mary Jacobs a suit of Apparel.

I leave my wife Jane Ford and my Son Edward Ford Executors of this my last Will and Testament.
