a decent manner at the Direction of my Ex^{rs} hereafter mentioned and as for what worldly Estate
it hath pleased God to bless me with I do give Devise and Dispose thereof in the following
Manner first I will and Devise that all my Just Debts be paid
Item I give and bequeath unto my eldest son Nicholas Reagan a feather Bed and Furniture
likewise I give and bequeath four hundred Acres of land unto the said Nicholas Reagan out of
this tract where I now live on to him and his two lawfully begotten of his Body and in default
of such live to be equally divided Amongst the Rest of my Children that is to say Sarah
Reagan which is the Wife of Mr Tolbot to Ann Reagan constant Reagan And Mildred
Reagan and their live lawfully be gotten of their Body
Item I give and bequeath to Ann Reagan a feather Bed and Furniture likewise I give and
bequeath to Constant Reagan a feather bed and Furniture and likewise I give and bequeath
unto Mildred Reagan a feather bed and Furniture. Item I give and bequeath unto Constant
Reagan and Mildred Reagan the Remainder of this tract of Land to be equally Divided
between them both allso this tract of Land at the new Church whereon Tho^s Crafford lives
to be Delivered to them at the age of eighteen or at the Day of Marriage to them and their
Male live lawfully begotten of their Body in default of such live to be returned to my well
Beloved Son Nicholas Reagan to him and his live for ever Item I give and bequeath unto
my son Michael Reagan one Shilling Sterling in Debarring him of any claim Right or
