In the name of God Amen I Michael Reagan of Fairfax County being sick and weak  
 of Body but of perfect Mind and memory do make this my last will and Testament Recollecting all  
 former wills and Testaments by me at any time heretofore made first and principally  
 I recommend my soul to almighty God that gave it and my body to the earth to be buried in  
 decent manner at the Direction of my Ex<sup>ors</sup> hereafter mentioned and as for what worldly Estate  
 it hath pleased God to bless me with I do give Devise and Dispose thereof in the following  
 manner first I will and Devise that all my Just Debts be paid  
 I do give and bequeath unto my eldest son Nicholas Reagan a feather Bed and Furniture  
 likewise I give and bequeath four hundred Acres of land unto the said Nicholas Reagan out of  
 this tract where I now live on to him and his lawfully begotten of his Body and in default  
 of such live to be Equally divided Amongst the Heirs of my Children that is to say Sarah  
 Reagan which is the Wife of Mr Tolbot to Ann Reagan constant Reagan and Mildred  
 Reagan and their live lawfully be gotten of their Body  
 I do give and bequeath to Ann Reagan a feather Bed and Furniture likewise I give and  
 bequeath to Constant Reagan a feather bed and Furniture and likewise I give and bequeath  
 unto Mildred Reagan a feather bed and Furniture. I do give and bequeath unto Constant  
 Reagan and Mildred Reagan the Remainder of this tract of Land to be Equally Divided  
 between them both also this tract of Land at the new Church whereon Tho<sup>s</sup> Crafford lives  
 to be Delivered to them at the age of eighteen or at the Day of Marriage to them and their  
 male live lawfully begotten of their Body in default of such live to be returned to my well  
 Beloved Son Nicholas Reagan to him and his live for ever I do give and bequeath unto  
 my son Michael Reagan one Shilling Sterling in Debarring him of any claim Title or  
 Title to any part of my Estate hereafter having given him more all ready than his part  
 of the Estate would come to. I do give and bequeath unto Margett Ash for a suit of Cloes  
 in Debarring her of any claim Title or Title to any part of my Estate having given her part  
 all ready. I do give and bequeath unto my well Beloved Wife Rebeckah Reagan  
 all the Rest of my Estate in during her natural life including this Plantation where I

Now lives on, it is my will and Desire that she shall not be Debarred of any Timber any Tree  
 or any so supply the Plantation and after her Decease to Dispose of the Lotate as she thinks proper among the  
 children, it is my will and Desire that she will give a equal part with the rest and to my Grand Daugh-  
 ter Sarah Reagan the Daughter of Peter Reagan, to be paid, at Eighteen or at the Day of Marriage &  
 acknowledge this to be my last will and Testament and I appoint my well Beloved wife Keturah Reagan  
 and my son Nicholas Reagan to be sole Executors to my last will and seal this 25<sup>th</sup>  
 of March 1750

 but in perfect Sence and Memory, Doe constitute and appoint this to be my last Will and Testament re-  
 voeking all other Wills that shall be by me made, If any such can be found. Impairing I give  
 my Soul to God who first gave it Hoping for a Joyfull Reception thro' the merits of Jesus Christ and  
 my Body to the Earth to be decently Buried at the Discretion of my Executors First I give and  
 Bequeath to my Daughter Patricia Simpson my best bed and Furniture, also I give and Bequeath  
 to my Grand Daughter Keturah my next best bed and Furniture, then I give to my son John Simpson  
 as much out of my Lotate as shall be of the Value of a Bed and Furniture, then I give and Bequeath  
 to my Loving Wife Elizabeth Simpson all the rest of my Lotate to her During her life, also it is my  
 Will and Desire that if the Stock should be too Burden some to her, that then she may sell or Dis-  
 pose of to her children as she thinks fit, then it is my Will and Desire that at the Death of my  
 said Wife, that my whole Lotate be Equally Divided amongst my whole children, Lastly  
 it is my Will and Desire that my son Gilbert Simpson and my Wife be Executors to this my last  
 Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and fixed my Seal this
