being at this time sick and weak but in sound mind & perfect  
memory makes the following dispositions of my worldly estate  
with which God has blessed me after my just debts & funeral  
expences are paid

Item I give and bequeath unto George Simpson the said land  
now lying on being part of two tracts to him of his heirs for  
ever. Item I give and bequeath unto Moses Simpson two  
hundred and four acres of land lying on the south side of  
which that I purchased of Sam Tollbird to him of his heirs for  
ever

I further will and bequeath the use of my slaves (to roll)  
Jack, Ben, James, Boson, Cale, Frank, Deyer, Tom, Roger, Abesare,  
Jack, Moll, Ben & Nan to my beloved wife Mary for maintaining  
her natural life, and after her decease, I will the said slaves

Hem I give and bequeath unto George Simpson two Negroes

Jack and Nefus, to him and his heirs

Hem I give and bequeath unto Pitchard Simpson two Slaves a Servt

Hem I give and bequeath unto Moses Simpson two Slaves Ben & Nan  
to him and his heirs for ever

Hem I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth Hally two  
slaves Elievan & Hagar to her and her for ever

Hem I give and bequeath unto Mary Windover two Slaves Brown  
and Cate

Hem I give and bequeath unto Mary Canterbury two Slaves  
Jack and Moll to her and her heirs for ever and in default  
of such heirs then I will the said Slaves to Elizabeth Hally &  
Mary Windover to be equally divided between them

Hem I give unto my grand Daughter Corin Hapnick one  
Negroe James. Hem I give unto my grandson George Windover  
one Negroe Frank. Hem I give and bequeath unto Pitchard  
Simpson two fether beds and furniture the choice of five  
my further desire is that the rest of my Estate personall  
shoud be equally divided between my wife four Children  
and this I declare and stablish to be my last Will and  
Testament revoking and disannulling all former and other  
Wills & Testaments by me heretofore made and I do make e  
plain constitude and appoint my two Sons George Simpson  
and Moses Simpson Executors of this <sup>my</sup> last Will and Testament  
Signed with my hand and sealed with my hand & sealed  
with my seal this 19<sup>th</sup> September in the year of our Lord 1761.

 Frances Hatley another Witness ordered to be recorded  
 and the Executors having performed what the Law requires  
 Certificate is granted them for obtaining a probate thereof  
 & in due form

Fairfax 1<sup>st</sup> In obedience to an order of Court we find upon an examination of the  
 personal estate of James Stein Deceased which was directed to be appraised and the product  
 divided among six of his Children that each Childs part according to the Appraisement  
 amounts to Thirty pounds one Shilling and six pence we have allotted goods and  
 cattle to two of the six Children Nicholas and Francis to the amount of the said  
 sum of Thirty pounds one Shilling and six pence each the rest of the personal not  
 given away in particular legacies remains with the heir at law who is accountable  
 to each Child for his her respective part
