 One thousand seven hundred and fifty eight I Rebeccah Wheeler wife of the
 Deceast Richard Wheeler of Stroo parish in the County of Faversham being weak of
 body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God therefor calling unto
 mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to
 die do make and ordain this my last will and Testament that is to say principally and
 first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it and for my body
 I recommend to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like and Decent manner at the discretion
 of my Executors not doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again
 by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God
 to bless me in this life I give Devise and Dispose in the following manner and form
 First I give and Bequeath to my dearly beloved daughter Susanna Williams and
 Susanna Simpson all my wearing Cloths to be Equally divided betwixt them
 Likewise to my dearly beloved son Edward Davis my own bed and Furniture thereto
 belonging.

Likewise to William Feizell the bed and Furniture thereto belonging that he lyson
 Together with the whole crop of corn wheat and Tobacco on the ground or in the houses
 at my decease likewise I will that my household Furniture horses Cattle hogs be Equally
 Divided betwixt the aforesaid Edward Davis and William Feizell

I Charles Green A.D. being in perfect health & by the blessing of God in sound mind, knowing that my time here is limited, wait for my Dissolution, & hoping a joyfull resurrection thro' Jesus Christ, & sincerely believing all the Articles of the Christian faith, do make the following disposition of my . . . worldly effects - My Body being first disposed of at the discretion of my Executor Imp. I give & bequeath unto the children of my Sisters Anna Maria Prendergast & Barbara Ware whatever I may have inherited in Ireland by the death of my Mother or otherwise — Item Whereas I executed a Deed of Trust to Coll^o. Batesby Bocke Rich^d Osborn & William Ramsay for the use of my wife, by w^{ch} I settled sundry tracts of land & sixteen Slaves some of which are since dead, I will that the said Deed have its full & proper effect, & not only so - but I give and bequeath further unto my loving wife Margaret Green & to her heirs for ever all the Land which I shall die possessed of in Virginia to sell or dispose of as she pleases also all my personal Estate whatsoever and Debts Bonds Bills &c. The paying out of the same the following legacies, To Elizabeth Osborn Daughter of Rob^t Osborn dec^d five pounds & to the youngest child of John King five pounds & to John Brionaugh son of Capt Jeremiah Brionaugh five pounds.

& I leave my wife aforesaid Executor sole of this my last will & Testament recommending to her to sell my Effects here & to go home to Dublin & live there Sealed & Signed this 6th day of November 1756. Chas: Green (L.S.)

John King owes me £ 6. 10. which if not paid before I die, I desire it may stand in charge so much of the above bequest of £ 5. to his child

If my wife shd. think proper to remain in Virginia if she marry I desire & before hand that she make some provision for her Sister Mary Bolan in case she should survive her
