To my daughter Francis Sanford and her heirs I give one negro girl named Nannon & one negro boy named

Aaron The residue of my Slaves I leave to be equally divided amongst my following Children their Heirs & after my wives death or widowhood Vizt. Robert James John and Edward Sanfords or their Heirs. All my Land I give & bequeath to my above named son Richard to him and his Heirs for ever. the residue of my Estate heretofore not given I leave to be equally divided all my Children after the death or widowhood of my wife Witnes my hand and seal this 23^d Day of March 1769. I appoint my sons Richard William and Robert Executors of this my last Will and Testament
