I leave to my son Robert Thomas one shilling Sterling.

I leave to my son Aaron Thomas one shilling Sterling.

I leave to my daughter Mary Mitchel one shilling Sterling.

I leave to my daughter Jerinnia Usher one shilling Sterling to be paid to each of them by my Executors all the rest & remainder of my estate that is the money to be equally divided between my well beloved wife and grandson William Mitchel my grandson Robt Thomas & my granddaughter Elizabeth

 to the ground to be buried decently at the discretion of my Ex^{ors}
 and I leave my worldly estate in manner as follows Vizt.
