I give and bequeath unto my nephew John Bryan at the time he shall arrive at the age of Twenty one years compleat one horse bridel and saddle of the value of six pounds current money and six pounds current money Item my further desire is that all the land that I shall die possessed of should equally divided into three parts. then I will one third part of my Land to my niece Mary An Hill daughter of John Canterbury Item then I will and bequeath the other two thirds of my Land to my beloved wife Mary the first choice to be at the free absolute disposal of my said wife forever Item I give and bequeath unto my wife Mary one negro girl named Honor to be at the free absolute disposal of my said wife for ever Item my further desire is that all the rest of my Estate should be equally divided into three parts then I will one third part to my niece Mary An Hill daughter of John Canterbury Item then I will and bequeath the other two parts to my beloved wife Mary to be at the free absolute disposal of my said wife for ever & this I declare and publish to be my last Will and Testament revoking and disannulling all former and other Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made and do make plain constitute and appoint my beloved wife Mary and Mary An Hill Executors of this my last Will and Testament signed with my hand and sealed with my seal this 7th day of March in the year of our Lord God 1762

In the name of God amen I Thomas Smith of the County of Fairfax
being sick and weak but of sound and disposing memory do make this will for . . .
settling my temporal concerns.

Item I give my son William Smith all my lands where ever situate and to his
heirs forever excepting & my desire is that if the Lands for which I have a suit agt
Col. Fielding Lewis be recovered then I direct the same to be sold by my said son
and the money equally divided between him and my two daughters Susannah &
Mary and their heirs. I also give my said son seven slaves name, old Will, Nell
Sibby, Lavy, Moses, Milly, & little Will, a mulatto servant name Mary Manley
and all the household goods, stocks of all kinds & plantations Utensils now in his pos-
sion also a feather bed and furniture which I have usually layen on, my Escutore . .
six silver spoons marked E. ^m A. and my two guns one of which commonly called

T. U. I desire may never be parted with out of the family.

Item I give to my daughter Mary seven slaves named Lucy, Frank, Satt, young, Sell
Lawrence, Charity & Robin one silver spoon marked GM. and the other half my stocks
and household goods at the home plantation to her and her heirs forever.

Item all the rents and out standing debts due to me with my crop of Tobacco I give &
after my debts paid to be equally divided between my wife and said two daughters

Item I give my wife the use of my whole estate during her life ^{and} at her death & not
before the same to go as above directed.

Lastly of this my last will I constitute my son William sole Executor
sealed with my seal this 15 day of March one thous and seven hundred . . .

and stocks at my home plantation to her & her heirs forever
