 do make and ordaine this my last will and testament in Manner & form following  
 I give and bequeath my Soul into the Hands of God that gave it hoping by the Merits  
 and mediator of my dear Saviour to receive the same at the Resurrection my body to  
 the Earth to be decently buryed at the Will of my Esq<sup>r</sup> hereafter named & as touching  
 that worldly Estate Wherewith it hath pleased God to Bless me withall I do bestow  
 it after the following manner I give my Servant Man named James Roles  
 to my beloved Wife Mary Bozman also my two pillow horoco a gray one called -  
 Picture and the other called Sorul and also three feather bedds this I now lie on and  
 the other stands on Side of this and the bedd my servant man lies on and likewise  
 the Womans Saddle which she rides on I give to my eldest daughter Sarah Hays the  
 Bed which she now lies on and furniture and the bedstead at Doshick I also give  
 her a horse called Whistler and one Iron pot and small frying pan and four  
 Cheroes. I give to my daughter Martha Bozman One feather bed and furniture  
 Bedstead Cord and Hide and also Four cheroes and one pot and one small frying  
 pan and also one pacing mare called Boney I give my daughter Betty one bed  
 and furniture and also the Colt that came of the pacing mare now going on one  
 year old one pot and one Frying pan and four Cheroes. It is my desire that the rest  
 of my Estate may be appraised and equilly divided into five parts amongst my  
 Wife and Children. It is my desire that my Servant Man named James Roles  
 which left to my Wife may have one year of his time if he serveth it truly and  
 honestly I do make and ordain Constitute and approue my dear wife Mary  
 Bozman and William Hays which is now married my daughter Sarah  
 Joynl Ex<sup>r</sup> of this my last Will and testament hereby revoking all former Wills  
 by me made as witness my hand & Seal this 4<sup>th</sup> day of December 1753  
 Signed Sealed and acknowledged to be  
 his Last Will in the presence of  
 David Fisher, John Henryford. The Wards Man named James Roles in the  
 Charles C. Littlejohn. tenth Line interlined before a signed and  
 mark. mark. otherwise,

Likewise the Woman's Saddle w<sup>ch</sup> the ride on in the thirteenth Line Underlined  
before a signed.

At a Court held and held for the County of Fairfax 22<sup>nd</sup> May 1754.  
This was presented in Court by William Hays Esq<sup>r</sup> therein named who made oath  
thereto and the same being proved by the oaths of David Liper & John Henry Ford two of  
the Witnesses & is admitted to record. And the said Executor having performed  
what is usual in such Cases Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate  
thereof in due form.
