In the name of God amen I Thomas Wren of the County of Fairfax & Parish aforesaid being sick & weak of body, but of perfect sense & memory thanks be to Almighty God for it, & calling to mind the frailty of my body, knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make this my last will & Testament in manner & form following Viz^t

First & principally I committ my Soul to Almighty God my body to the Earth there to be buried according to the discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned.

Secondly, all my debts lawfully contracted may be honestly & justly paid then what worldly goods it has pleased God to bless me with I dispose of in manner & form following

Item I give & bequeath unto my beloved son Nicholas Wren ten shillings current money, he having had his full part before.

Item. I give & bequeath unto my loving son William Wren, the Lease of land whereon I now live & two negroes named Dick & Sam, after his mother's death to him & his heirs forever.

Item. I give & bequeath unto my loving son John Wren, one negroe boy named Daniel a mother's death to him & his heirs forever.

Item. I give & bequeath to loving son Travers Wren one negroe Boy named Harry, after his mothers death to him & his heirs forever.

Item. I give & bequeath to my loving son Isaac Wren one negroe girl named Calce & her future increase after his mothers death to him & his heirs forever.

Item. I give & bequeath unto my loving daughter Winney Alhill, ten shillings current money, she having had her full part before.

Item. I give & bequeath unto my loving daughter Ann Wren one negroe girl named Lucy & her future increase at her coming of age or day of marriage to her & her heirs forever.

Item. I give & bequeath unto my loving daughter Mary Wren one negroe boy named Ben, & one bed & furniture at her coming of age or day of marriage, to her & her heirs forever.

Item. I lend my dear & loving wife Jean Wren the Lease of land whereon I live & seven negroes named Dick, Sarah, Peg, Daniel, Sam, Harry, Calce & their future increase withall my stocks & household furniture & the brood of Tobacco & corn to pay my just debts, except the bed & furniture I have given to my daughter Mary Wren; & after my wife's death Sarah & Peg & all the stock & household furniture to be equally divided among my four sons William Wren, John Wren, Travers Wren, Isaac Wren.

Lastly. I nominate & appoint my loving wife Jean Wren, my Executors also my four sons William Wren, John Wren, Travers Wren & Isaac Wren, Executors with her. & I do hereby revoke & disannull all former Wills by me made & declare this writing contained on this & the foregoing pages only to be my last will & Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this eighth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & sixty seven.
