calling to mind the uncertainty of Life in this World do (with re-
commending my Soul to the care of God & resigning my Body to
the Earth) make this my last Will and Testament Vizt:
Impuris It is my will and desire that my Executors do
collect all such Debts as shall appear to be due to my Estate
after my death.

Item It is my Will and Desire that my Executors if she
shall think there is more Stock belonging to my Estate then she
can maintain, do dispose of any part thereof, as she shall chose
and one half of the money arising from any such sale I give &

bequeath to my son James Moore and his Heirs for ever.
The other half I give and bequeath the use thereof during her natu-
ral Life or Widowhood to my loving wife Mary Moore & after her
death or Widowhood I give and bequeath the said money to my sⁿ
son James Moore and his Heirs for ever; But if my Executors
should not dispose of the whole, or only part of my Stock, I give &
bequeath to my said wife Mary Moore the whole or that part
which shall remain unsold, the use thereof during her natural
Life or so long as she shall remain a widow; & after her death or
widowhood I give & bequeath all the said Stock or that part which
shall remain unsold to my son James Moore and his Heirs forever.
Item I give and bequeath to my wife Mary Moore the four fol-
lowing Slaves Vizt: Mouser Sue Jane and Hagar, the use thereof
during her natural life or so long as she shall remain a widow, and
after her Death or Widowhood I give & bequeath the said Slaves Mouser
Sue Jane & Hagar to my son James Moore and his Heirs forever.
Item I give and bequeath unto my son James Moore and his
heirs for ever one negro man named Gato; also my Case & two Guns
Item His my Will and Desire that the Mortgages I have on the
Lands of John Anderson be foreclosed according to Law which said
Lands I give and bequeath to my son James Moore and his
heirs for ever.
Item I give and bequeath to my son Samuel Moore and his
heirs for ever one shilling sterling, to be paid by my Executors.
Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Little John
and her heirs for ever one shilling sterling to be paid by my
Executors.
Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Ducklin &
her heirs for ever one shilling sterling to be paid by my Executors
Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Ann Tyler and her heirs
forever one shilling sterling to be paid by my Executors.
Item I give and bequeath, all the rest and residue of my Estate
real or Personal the use thereof to my loving wife Mary Moore
during her natural life or Widowhood, and after her death or widow-
hood I give and bequeath all the same to my son James Moore &
his heirs for ever.

Executrix and my loving son James Moore Executor of this my last
Will and Testament, ratifying and confirming this and only this
to be my last Will and Testament, disannulling & making void all

 the following my last Will & Testament,
 I Imprescribes I give and devise unto my dear wife
 Priscilla Sebastian for and during her life All that my
 Tract or parcel of Land whereon I now live situate in the
 County aforesaid known by the name of Mountpelier as

 fifty Acres more or less shall be sold in fee simple by my Friends
 Thomas Lewis and John Mops of the same County for the
 payment of my just Debts whom I constitute and appoint
 my Executors for that purpose and for all other matters & things
 concerning & respecting me in the County of Loudoun.
