and paying unto my Daughter Katharine Connell one pound thirteen
shillings and four pence Current money of Virginia

Item my will is that a negro man named Frank now belonging to me shall
not be sold or maid a slave unto any person or persons whatsoever upon
the following Conditions only the said negro Frank shall pay in three years
time after my Decease unto my Executors the sum of sixty five pounds current
money of Virginia and ten pounds like money yearly and each year and that for
the full and Compleat term of Seventeen years succeeding the first three years
after my decease and if it should please God to prolong the said negro Franks
Life my will is that he shall pay unto my said Executors five pounds like
money yearly and each year and that for the space of Five years after
the expiration of the abovementioned Twenty years and if the Life of the said
Negro should be further prolonged then the said Frank shall pay unto my
Executors their heirs &c. the sum of Five shillings like money yearly and each
year during the Remaining part of his Life all which Respective sums he the
said Frank shall pay unto my said Executors their Executors administrators or

Assigns otherwise my said Executors or their heirs &c. shall hereby have full power and Authority to hire or dispose of the said Negro by sale or otherwise as they in their Discretion shall think proper untill the said Frank shall comply with this my will and the money arising therefrom to be paid unto the following Legacies

Item I give unto my son Benjamin Berkley Fifty pounds current money to be paid him by my Executors in three years time out of the first money they shall receive of negro Frank which sum of Fifty pounds I give unto him the said Benjamin & his heirs forever

Item I give unto my son William Berkley four pounds current money yearly and each year and that for the space of Twenty years to be paid him his heirs &c. by my said Executors out of the money they shall receive of said Frank after Benjamin Berkley is paid & likewise give unto my son William Berkley all my Waring apparel except my best suit of cloths which wearing apparel and Five pounds and that for the space of Twenty years I give unto him the said William Berkley and to his heirs forever

Item I give unto my Daughter Eleanor Fields decessed or at least to her eldest son John Fields the sum of Twelve Shillings and six pence current money to be him by my Executors out of the money they shall receive of negro Frank which is Twelve Shillings & six pence I give unto the said John and his heirs

Item I give unto my grandson William Fields nineteen pounds seven Shillings and six pence current money to be paid him in four years time after he shall come of age out of the money negro Frank shall pay my Executors after the three first years of William

Burkley's salary is paid which said Money I give to the 312
said William Fields and his heirs forever

Item I give unto my Grand daughter Jane Burris ten pounds current money to be paid her by my said Executors out of the money they shall receive of negro Frank in two years after William Fields is paid which Ten pounds I give to her the said ^{Jane and} her heirs

Item I give to my son Samuel Berkley one Negro boy called George my large Chest and all the Lark that belongs to me with my best suit of Cloathes ^{wearing} I likewise give the said Samuel after the death of his mother Elizabeth the Plantation whereon I now live with one negro Child Cash Cloathes & Plantation I give unto the said & Samuel and to his heirs

Item I give unto my Daughter Ann Beikley one negro boy called James with one third part of all the Household Furniture, Stock upon my Plantation Debt or money due & belonging to at the time of my decease after my Lawfull debts are paid & paying out of her third part Daughter Catharine Connell one pound thirteen Shillings and four pence current money which said negro boy one third part of household Furniture Stock on the Plantation Debt or money due and belonging to me at the time of my decease I give unto her the said Ann & to her heirs forever

Item I give unto my Daughter Allethia Beikly one negro Girl called Femina with one third part of Household Furniture Stock on my Plantation Debt or money due & belonging to me at the time of my Decease after my Lawfull Debts are paid & paying out of her

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Third I give unto my Daughter Catharine Connell one pound thirteen
shillings and fourpence Current money which negro I give one third part of
Household Furniture Stock on the Plantation Debt or money due &
belonging to me at the time of my ^{decease} I give unto the said Althea Berkeley
and her heirs forever.

Item I give unto my Daughter Catharine Connell Five pounds
Current money which is to be paid her by my Wife Elizabeth And
Ann & Althea Berkeley as before mentioned which five pounds I
give to the said Catharine & her heirs

Item I give unto my son Reuben Berkeley one negro man named
George he paying Jane Mahony Fifteen pounds Current money which
negro on them Conditions I give to the said Reuben & to his heirs

Item I give unto my Daughter Jane Mahony the sum of Fifteen
pounds current money which is to be paid by Reuben Berkeley out of his
Legacy which Fifteen pounds I give to the said Jane Mahony &
