In the name of God amen I William Dulin of the Parish of Truro in the County of Fairfax in the colony of Virginia Charter being weak in body but of sound Memory (blessed be God) do this twenty sixth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and fifty six make and publish this my Last will and Testament in the manner and form following.

Item I give and bequeath to my son William Dulin ten pounds Virginia Currency to be due to him on the day of my decease

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sydia Halbert ten pounds of said money and one thousand pounds of Tobacco

Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah Mife five pounds of the said money

Item I give and bequeath to my son John Dulin one negro man named Sack to him the said John and his heirs for ever

Item I give and bequeath to my son Edward Dulin my Young Mare called Beauty or also my bridle and saddle

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Ann Beach one Negro Girl named Fanny to her the said Mary Ann & her increase to her the said Mary Ann and her heirs for ever

Item I give & bequeath to my said Mary Anne Beach her heirs &
 heirs

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Ann Dulon one Negro
 boy named Sam to her the said Ann & her heirs forever

Item I give & bequeath to my said Daughter Ann Dulon one Feather
 bed and furniture as also one Cow and calf

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Bathsheba Dulon one Negro
 Woman named Lucy to her the said Bathsheba with her increase to
 the said Bathsheba and her heirs forever as also one Feather bed &
 Furniture all to be delivered to the said Bathsheba at the day of mar-
 riage as also one Cow and calf

Item I give and bequeath to my Grandson William Popjoy ten pounds
 Virginia Curr. to be paid to him the said William at the age of
 twenty one years and if he the said William die within the said term
 of twenty one years that then the said Legacy to be divided between
 his Sisters Lydia and Sarah Popjoy

Item my Will is the above Legacy to my daughter Ann Dulon
 on the day of her marriage be paid her the said Ann Dulon

Item my will is that my well beloved wife Elizabeth Dulon be and
 remain in full Possession of all my Estates and to have the use of the
 same during her Life except such Legacies as above appointed to be
 discharged otherwise

Item My will is that after my just debts and legacies are duly
 paid that the residue of my Estates be it of what kindsoever be either
 equally divided in kind and the money equally divided among all
 the above Legatees

Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my son John Dulon as
 also my son in Law Thomas Beach to be my sole Executors of this
 my last will and Testament by me made hereby revoking & making
 void all other Wills and Testaments by me made In Witness whereof
 I the said William Dulon have to this my last will and Testament
