Item, I give and bequeath unto my loving Cousin George Adams in Maryland one feather bed and bolster all my Carpenters and Joiners Tools: ~ ~

Item, I give and bequeath unto my loving Cousin Peter Adams in Maryland one feather bed and bolster my whole set of surveying Instruments: ~ ~

Item, I give and bequeath unto Francis Adams son of Benjamin Adams in Virginia one Feather bed and bolster and a two year old heifer: ~ ~

Item, I give and bequeath unto my loving brother George Godfrey in Maryland my long gun which was my Father's: ~ ~

Item, I give and bequeath unto my loving Cousin Abdonago Adams all my Land and the remainder part of my Estate: ~ ~

My Will and desire is that my loving Cousin Abdonago Adams be whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking and disannulling all other wills or wills formerly made by me In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the day and year above written: ~ ~
