County of Fairfax being in perfect sense and memory thanks be to almighty God for the same
and considering the uncertainty of this transitory life to prepare myself and declare this
my last Will and Testament in manner and form following first I recommend & bequeath
my immortal Soul to my Heavenly Father that gave it in full faith of his mercifull pardon
and forgiveness of all my sins & thro the merits of my blessed Saviour & Redeemer
Christ Jesus and of a joyful resurrection at the last day to amens fading state of
Glory and as for the worldly Estate of which his great Goodness has been pleased to end
me I dispose thereof as followeth

I give all and singular my Estate only what I have already given by Deeds of Gifts to my four
Sons Edward Payne, Sanford Payne and John Payne to be equally divided
between my wife and all my Sons and Daughters if they come to demand their parts within
one year after my death, if not the part not demanded may be given to my Son Mr^r Payne
and John Payne and their Heirs and it is my further Will and desire that my son Edward
Payne have the possession care and education of my son John Payne & his Estate until he
shall come to the age of eighteen years or twenty one years as my son Edward Payne shall
think fit. It is my desire that the Deed made to my three wives bearing date the first
day of August seventeen hundred and sixty five shall be rightly understood that of my
son John, should by without her then the said mentioned Estate be equally divided
between my surviving wives & their heirs and I do hereby appoint my son Edward
Payne my whole sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament and that he shall
pay off all my just Debts and then my Legacies in a reasonable time and it is my
desire that the plantation wherein I now live is that if my wife chooses to live on
it she may not be disturbed and in case she dont chose to live on the said planta-
tion herein is my desire that my son Edward Payne have it sealed & signed as hereunder
