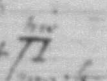
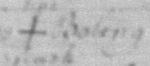


In the name of God Amen William Moxley of the County of Kent and parish

my last will and testament in manner and form as follows. I give and bequeath
to my well beloved wife Jane Moxley y^e use of one negro boy named Cass during her life
and after her decease I give the said negro boy to my son Daniel Moxley and his heirs
Item I give to my wife the use of one feather bed and furniture during her life Item I likewise
give to my said wife the use of two cows and calves & to have the first choice during her
life I likewise give to my said wife during her life the use of one horse or mare at her
choice Item I also give to my said wife Jane Moxley a servant woman named Jane Hind
during her coverture I also give to my said wife a woman a saddle and bridle during her life
Item I give to my son Samuel Moxley a negro boy named George & one feather bed and
furniture to him and his heirs Item I give to my son Thomas Moxley a negro boy
named Harry & a feather bed and furniture which I lent to his mother after her
decease to him & his heirs Item I give to my son Nathaniel Moxley a negro girl
named Bess to him and his heirs Item if either of my three sons Samuel Thomas
or Nathaniel should die before they arrive to the age of eighteen years or without
heirs then what I have given him to be sold & the money arising therefrom to be
equally divided between the two surviving brothers Item I give to my wife Jane
Moxley the plantation I now live on during her life and after her decease I give the
said plantation to my son Samuel Moxley Item I give to my daughter Sibbel Burth
two large Braker dishes to be delivered to her after the death of my wife Item I give to
my daughter Hannah Horgan two large Braker dishes to be delivered to her after the
death of my wife Item I give Martha Belling a feather bed and furniture to be delivered
to her after the death of my wife Item I give to my daughter in law Jane Watkins a
cow & calf to be delivered to her at the day of marriage Item I give to my son William
Moxley twenty shillings current money if he ever comes to demand it I also give
to my daughter Margaret twenty shillings like money I also give to my daughter
Anne Shale twenty shillings of like money I also give to my daughter Elizabeth Lane
twenty shillings of like money if ever they come to demand it and my desire is that
all the remaining part of my estate be sold and the money to be equally divided
between my sons Daniel Samuel Thomas & Nathaniel Moxley & my three daughters

 Subscribed & Hannah Reagan, I also leave my three sons Saml. Tho^r and
 Nathaniel. Morley to be of age when they arrive to the age of eighteen years And the
 Estates I have left them to be Delivered to them when they come to that age it is
 my Desire that my son Saml. Morley should be bound to a profitable Trade by my
 Executors hereafter named. I likewise leave my three sons to the care of Jacob &
 Isobell & what I have given them til they come to the age of eighteen years the way
 boy left to my son Saml. it is my Desire he should help support the rest of the
 young Children till my son Saml. be of age. I likewise give the care of my children &
 the use of my whole Estate to my wife During her widowhood. I also constitute &
 appoint my son Daniel Morley & Edward Bonning my whole and sole Executors
 of this my last will and Testament as witnesses whereof I have hereunto set my
 hand & seal this third day of March on thousand seven hundred & fifty two
