Trenton parish in the county of Fairfax being sick in Body but of a
sound & perfect memory do make and ordain this my last will &
Testament in manner following Vizt. First I recommend my soul &
into the hands of Almighty God who gave it me and my Body to
the earth to be decently interred at the discretion of my Executors &
hereafter named

Item I give and devise to my loving son John Peake and to his
heirs forever the tract of land & Plantation on which I now live being
the land my father bought of Thomas Baxter also the tract of land
purchased by my Grandfather of Robert Collingsworth joining
to the aforesaid tract of land also the following slaves Vizt. One
negro woman named Sue and a negro girl named Mitty with
their future increase also five leather chairs and my horse called
Jockery and one negro girl called Sena. Item I give and
devise to my loving son Humphrey Peake and to his heirs for-
ever one Hundred and fifty acres of Land lying on Little hunting

Spah

Creek, being the Land my father bought of Benoni Tidlett & whereon he now lives and also all that tract of Land lying on Little Hunting Creek which my father bought of John Todd except the Plantation whereon Abednego Adams now lives including one hundred acres which I reserve for my daughter. Mary also I give and bequeath to my said son Humphrey the following slaves Viz^t one negro man named Caesar one negro boy named Ben and one negro Girl named Alice also one Silk rug one mare called Flower & her colt and five leather chairs

Item I give and devise to my loving daughter Mary Adams and to the heirs of her body lawfully begotten forever all that tract of Land and Plantation whereon she now lives including with the plantation one hundred acres of Land lying on the fork of Little hunting creek and is the same mentioned to be taken out of the tract devised to my son ^{Humphrey} and to be bounded as follows Viz^t Beginning at a spanish oak standing on the Creek side at the bottom of an old orchard & running from thence along the meanders of the north branch of the said Creek to a white oak corner on the north fork thence along the back line and from thence a straight line to the beginning to include one hundred acres also one negro woman slave named Kate and her future increase to her & the heirs of her Body lawfully begotten forever and in default of such heirs I give & Devise the aforesaid Tract of Land & negro Kate with her future increase to my son John Drake & his heirs forever

Also I give & bequeath to my said Daughter Mary one Cow & calf two heifers one feather bed & bolster one pair of sheets 1 Blanket one Rug two pewter Dishes six pewter plates one Iron pot & three Large silver spoons

Also I give and devise to my Loving daughter Sarah and to
 the heirs heirs of her body Lawfully begotten forever one hundred &
 fourteen acres of Land being part of a tract which my Father bought
 of John Vaughn also the following negro slaves Viz: two negro boys named
 George & Bob one negro woman named Bess & negro girl named Peg
 and their future increase to her & the heirs of her body Lawfully begotten
 forever and in default of such heirs I give and devise the said Tract
 of Land and negro slaves to my sons John & Humphrey and their
 heirs forever to be equally divided between them, also I give &
 bequeath to my said Daughter Sarah one feather bed and bolster
 two pillows one pair best sheets one Blanket one white cotton & a
 Counterpane with the Curtains bedsted and and Hide one iron
 pot & hook three pewter dishes six pewter plates one brass Kettle one
 Box Iron & heaters. I haul one Pig one horse called Morth one mare
 called Betty & all her colts three Large Silver spoons six silver &
 tea spoons, two high leather chairs and two ^{low} leather chairs one
 tea Kettle and tea ware one dressing glass ten hogs two cows &
 Calves two heifers and one four year old steer and the newest walnut
 Table. Also I give to my said Daughter Sarah the use of my &
 negro man slave named Harry and my horse called mundary
 during the time she remains single and if she marries then I
 give the said Slave to be equally divided between my said Daughter
 Sarah and my sons John & Humphrey and the horse to my son
 Humphrey

Also I give and devise to my sons John & Humphrey and to their
 heirs forever one hundred acres of Land lying on the Crooked
 branch of Occoquan in the county of Prince William adjoining to

The land my father gave to my son William which he purchased of
Wansford Arrington which said one hundred acres of Land I purchased of
William Bland

Also I desire that my estate may not be appraised

AND Further it is my will and desire that all the rest and residue
of my estate not herein before bequeathed after the payment of my
Just debts & Legacies be equally divided between my sons John
and Humphry and my daughter Sarah

Also it is my will that my said Daughter Sarah have the use &
Benefit of the plantation wherein I now live for one year next after
my decease

Lastly I nominate constitute and appoint my loving sons John
Peake and Humphry Peake Executors of this my Last will & Testa-
ment hereby revoking all others by me at any time heretofore
made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand & Seal
this 11th day of January 1761.


