I William Adams of Fairfax <sup>County</sup> being sick & weak but perfect sense and memory (thank<sup>s</sup> be to God for it) do make this my last will and testament in manner and form as followeth first I desire of God to receive my soul and as for what worldly estate with which it bin pleased God to bless me with I give the same as followeth Item I give to my wife Catharine Thomas three Cows and Calves & a young heifer three young steers and all my hogs one house and 9 Moar & all my household furniture to Joseph Adams my best Goat to Ann Adams one young mare to William Adams a young horse saddle and bridle and a suit of Cloath if he lives with Catharine Thomas till he is at age and my two guns to be sold I appoint my loving wife Catharine Thomas sole and sole Executer of this my last will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunder set my hand and seal this 21<sup>st</sup> day of January 1755.

Thos. Gibon, Robert <sup>mark</sup> to be divided between her and my sister's children
