perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God therefore calling to  
mind the mortatility of my body and knowing that it is appointed for  
all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament  
that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul  
into the hands of Almighty god who gave it, and my body I recommend  
to the earth to be buried in decent Christian buriel at the discretion of  
my executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall  
receive the same again by the mighty power of God, But as touching such  
worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this  
Life I give demise and dispose of the same in the following manner as  
followeth to wit— Item I give and bequeath unto my son John

in the state of Kentucky the said Willoughby Griffith having the first cho  
ice in one piece out of two thousand and fifty acres he paying his proportion  
part toward clearing out said land to him and his heirs forever  
Item I give and bequeath unto my son John Griffith five hundred acres  
land in Kentucky adjoining to the land of his brother Willoughby  
Griffith he paying the proportionable part towards clearing it out  
him and his heirs forever Item I give and bequeath to my four Da  
ughters, Amelia Owens Rachael Gruel, Peggy Griffith and Susanna Griff  
the remainder of said land in Kentucky being one thousand and fifty  
to be equally divided between them each paying their proportionable  
part

2 towards clearing it out to them and their heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Peggy one bed and furniture one cow <sup>and</sup> one Ewe and Lamb and six pewter plates to be raised out of my estate to her and her heirs forever. Item <sup>I also</sup> give and bequeath to my Daughter Saraianne one bed and furniture one cow and one Ewe and Lamb and six pewter plates to be raised out of my estate to her and her heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my son Dennis <sup>the</sup> Griffith the Horse called his one cow one Ewe & Lamb, one bed and furniture also I give and bequeath unto my son Dennis after his mothers Death the plantation whereon I now live and land adjoining containing one hundred and sixty three acres more or less to him and his heirs forever. But in case he the said Dennis Griffith should die in his mothers life time without heirs the said land at her death ~~is to be sold~~, and the money arising from said sale to be equally divided among my then surviving children. Item I give and bequeath to my Dearly beloved wife Sarah Griffith during her natural life or widowhood she making no waste or destruction upon the plantation whereon I now live and all and singular the remainder of my moveable estate after the legacies above mentioned is paid off and after her Death I leave the said moveable Estate to be sold and the sum arising from said sale to be equally divided among my then surviving children and I appoint my son Elijah Griffith Executor and my wife Executrix of this my last will and Testament to take care to see the same performed according to my true intent and meaning and I do hereby disannul and revoke all former wills by me heretofore made ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto put my hand and seal the day and year first above written.


