Eighthly all the rest of my Estate both real and Personal after my Decise it is my desire should be sold at publick sale to the highest bidder, for twelve months credit, the purchaser to give bond with approved security and if not punctual payment to bear Interest from the date, and the money arising therefrom to be equally divided between my ten children.
