In the name of God Amen, I John Thornbury of Fauquier County and State of Virginia being weak of Body but of sound mind and memory (Blessed be god) do this twenty third day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety five make and publish this my last will and Testament in manner following (that is to say) I impremises I bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Thornbury the use of the Plantation and Land whereon I now live Supposed to contain about four hundred and eighty six Acres and lies Between the Lands which I directed to be laid off for my sons Henry, Samuel and Francis Thornbury to be possessed and enjoyed by her the said Elizabeth with the appurtenances thereto Belonging for and during her Natural life or widowhood and no longer if she the said Elizabeth intermarries again my Will and Desire is that she forfeits the said land and my will and desire is that after the decease or marriage of my said wife Elizabeth which ever shall first happen or be the case that then my Will and desire is that my Beloved son William Thornbury take Possession of the Plantation whereon I now live and one Moiety or half of the Supposed four hundred and eighty six Acres and that my Beloved son Thomas Thornbury take Possession Likewise of the other part supposed to contain two hundred and forty three Acres to have and to hold to each the said William and Thomas the said land and
