In the Name of God amen This is the last will and testament of James Craig of the Parish of Hamilton and County of Gauger Clark. In the first place I do hereby liberate and set free all my slaves Miz; old Tom and Wimmy her wife and her future increase together with all her present children now living to wit. Billy young Tom. Suky. Sam. Sally and Molly. Also my negro man Bob with his three children Harry. Scipio and Moses and I do require my Executors here after to be named to do all such acts as may be necessary or expedient to effect this my wish. I do give to my Executors the sum of twenty pounds current money for the use of old Tom and Wimmy and their children and the sum of twenty five pounds for the use of Bob and his three sons to be laid out by my said Executors in such stocks implements of Husbandry and Household furniture or otherwise as they shall think proper. I give unto Joseph Craig my brother the sum of one hundred pounds sterling to be paid in twelve months after my death in case he survives me, but if he should not then I give the same to the children of John and Margarets Doby their son James Doby to be excepted to be divided equally amongst them. I give unto James Doby my nephew the sum

of one hundred pounds current money to be paid in twelve months after my death in case he survives me and also the whole of my stocks of every kind household and kitchen furniture and plantation utensils. I give unto Samuel Holiday the sum of four hundred pounds current money to be paid in twelve months after my death if he survives me. I give unto Jane Stewart the widow of James Stewart the sum of ten pounds current money in case she survives me, but if she does not, then I give the same to her daughter Betty Stewart; I give unto Jane Smith the widow of Alexander Smith five pounds current money if she survives me. I give unto Mrs Williams mother in law of Copam Day the sum of five pounds current money if she survives me. I do hereby appoint Messieurs Gavin Lawson of the County of Stafford merchant and William Allason of the County of Fauquier Executors of this my last will, and I give to each of them the sum of fifty pounds currency, I give and devise to my said Executors or the survivors of them and to the Heirs of such survivors forever all my property real and personal to dispose of and convey the same as they think fit for the benefit of my brother Joseph Craig the children of John and Margaret Doby (the said James Doby to be excepted) and the children of the said James Doby, subject to the payment of my just debts and funeral expenses and to the different legacies above mentioned. And that in the following proportion to wit one fourth part thereof to the said Joseph Craig, another fourth to the children of John and Margaret Doby to be equally divided amongst them (the said James Doby excepted) and the remaining two fourths to the children of the said James Doby and Ann his wife that may be alive at the time of my death to be equally divided amongst them. My will is that my property shall not be appraised and that my Executors shall not be obliged to give security In Testimony whereof I have writ this with my own hand and signed and sealed the same this second day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Ninety two.


