In Obedience to a secretal order of the worshippfull Court of Saugus directing us to divide the Real and personal Estate of James McClanahan deceased we have proceeded in the first place to divide the lands, not agreeable to quantity and quality, but agreeable to quantity, and therfore apertained the value of each lot, and directed the sum to be paid from the most valuable to the least valuable lots, which we did at the request of all the distributees the lots were then divided by drawing; the dower lands we consider as being laid off equal in quantity and quality agreeable to a platto herewith returned, which represents all the lots of the above lands so divided by us we have also proceeded to assign the widows dower in the slaves, and personal Estate, and then to divide the residue thereof among the other

354 distribution, which we have endeavoured so far as it relates to the slaves
to divide in kind as near as we could each of the distributees (that is the
children of the Intestate) produced accounts of all the money or other pro-
perty received from the deceased in his lifetime which were sworn to
this sum amounting £161. We did not add to the aggregate amount
till after we had ascribed the Dower of the widow. Considering that
sum as having been given away in the life time of the Intestate and no
part of his Estate at the time of his death, we have also proceeded
to make up an account for each of the distributees and also a
