In the name of God amen I John Tompkins a citizen of the Commonwealth of Virginia and at present at Hixton Samuel Stiles in Fauquier County being of sound mind and memory do make and ordain this and no other my last will and testament in manner and form following (viz) Item I give and bequeath to my beloved wife the sum of two thousand dollars current money to be paid to her out of the first money that shall come to the hands of my executors herein after named, I also give and bequeath to my beloved wife the feather bed and furniture that I received with her to her and her heirs forever and a negro woman named Minny and two large trunks to her and her heirs, Item I give and bequeath to my brother Fortunatus Tompkins and his heirs forever the sum of Fifty pounds current money of Virginia to be paid him out of the next money that may come to the hands of my executors (after the money given to my wife is paid to her) as it is my wish and express desire that she shall be first paid, and be certain to receive the sum of money and bed to so devised and given to her Item I desire that my two slaves Emby and Celah be hired out Emby for the term of four years to commence on the first day of January after my death and Celah for the term of ten years to commence on the first day of January after my death and at the expiration of their respective times of service it is my will that they both receive their freedom and if the said Celah should have a child or children before the term of ten years expires it is my express will that the same child or children receive his her or their freedom if a male or males at twenty one years of age and if female or females at eighteen years of age, Item it is my will and desire that my executors sell my land giving a credit of twelve months and also sell my chair and Harness horse watch and furniture giving a credit of six months the purchaser or purchasers entering into bond with such security in every instance as shall be approved of by my executors and the money arising from such sale or sales together with all the residue of my Estate (except the two legacies before given) be equally divided between all my brothers and sisters that are now living and the children or children of those that are dead it is my express will that those of my brothers or sisters that are dead and left issue that the child or children so left shall have the same part that his her or their Parent would have been entitled to if he or she had been living on the day of the date of this will and testament (my brother Fortunatus is not to be considered as one of the heirs in this last devise the fifty pounds given to him is to be in full of his part of my Estate Lastly I nominate and appoint my two brothers Christopher and Henry Tompkins Executors to this my last will and testament In witness whereof I the said John Tompkins have hereunto set my hand and seal the 25th day of June Eighteen hundred and two The words negro woman names Minny signed sealed acknowledged published and declared by the testator as his last will and intended before signed
