 I give also to my said wife the following Stock of Horses Viz one call'd
 a Drummer, mare named Fancy, one name pall, a small black
 Horse, and another in Bay Horse call'd Gitter and a bay mare which
 she now makes use of as her riding Mare, likewise I give unto my
 Wife Lydia the following stock of Cattle, Hogs and Sheep, Viz five
 Milch Cows, twenty head of Hogs, and ten head of sheep to be her
 first Choice out of my whole Stock. Also I give unto my wife two
 feather Beds also one half of all my Household furniture besides except
 the Beds also I give unto her as much of my plantation utensils as
 she may think necessary to make use of in cultivating said plantation,
 and also the Waggon and gun for each Horse -

Item I give unto my son Joseph a Negro boy named Tom, also a Horse
 call'd Jackfire and the one third part of all my Lands lying in
 the State of Kentucky, to him and his Heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Smith
 negro boy name'd Stephen to her and his Heirs forever

Item I give unto my son James the one third part of all my
 Lands lying in Fauquier County after the Death of my wife which
 said Lands are to be equally Divided in quantity and my said
 Son James is to have his choice of said Lands and may proceed after
 decease immediately to make the Division but is not to prevent his

Nothing from clearing or cultivating any part during her life said Land I gave to my son James & his Heirs forever, also I give unto my said Son James one Negro boy named William and a negro girl named black betty, also one Feather Bed, and my stud Horse also I give unto my said Son James three hundred pounds Cash to be paid to him as soon after my decease — as it can be collected out of a Bond due me from John Love to him and his Heirs forever Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Gemina Johnston one negro boy named Solomon to her and her Heirs forever Item I give and bequeath to my son Isham a negro man named Philip, one feather Bed and furniture and a yearling Coll come of a Mare call'd fancy, and also the one third part of all my Land at Kentucky, and also forty pounds Cash to be paid as soon as the Money can be collected from the sale of my present Crop of Wheat to him and his Heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my son Eleas one third part of all my Land lying in the State of Kentucky, one negro man named great Will, one feather Bed and furniture, also one bay Coll and also the coll that the bay mare is now with foal of and forty pounds Cash as soon as it can be collected out of the Debts due me to him and his Heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my son John O'Baron the one third part of all my Land lying in Fauquier County Virg, the second part to be laid on the lower part of the Land so as to include the quarter also one Negro Boy named Warwick and woman named Wimpy also one bay Horse he now uses and a sorrel Coll at the quarter, one feather Bed and furniture and forty pounds Cash to be paid as soon as can be collected out of the debts due me to him and his Heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my son William all the residue of my Land lying in this County also one negro man named Alexander and a woman named Rachel, one feather Bed and furniture a Horse

called Doncarl's and a Cott come out of a Sordlman and also forty pounds
cash to be paid as soon as can be collected out of the Dots due me to him
and his Heirs forever

Item it is my desire that the negro Woman called Jude shall be continued
under the care of my Wife during her life Also it is my desire that
the whole expence of clearing out securing my Kentucky Lands should
be paid out of my Estate not heretofore given, and where is it my desire
that the residue of my Estate not already given after discharging all my
just Debts should be equally Divided between the whole of my Children
above named or their Heirs, and lastly I do hereby revoke all former
Wills by me heretofore made and do declare this to be my last Will and
Testament. And do appoint my wife Lydia Executrix and my Son



Captⁿ Hancock Lee has a land warrant of nine for eight hundred and forty eight and a half acres which I wish to be located and disposed of for the benefit of my creditors and wish Mr Joseph Blackwell merchant to take possession of what little I am in possession for the benefit of my creditors and make disposal of it after my decease. True there is part mortgaged to Kindall Lee; which mortgage may be easily got from Thomas Edwards of Northumberland Clerk of that District Court. I would wish Edward Digges Junior to inherit this lot of land after my wife's decease on condition that he will advance fifty Pounds to my Creditors the lot has cost me six times as much, and more, without mentioning the first purchase; I think I cannot do justice to those I am indebted to without this reserve and am persuaded he may make his money
