In the name of God. AMEN.

I Abram Perkins of the County of Fluvanna being sound in
Body yet of sound mind and Memory do constitute and ordain
this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form
following (to wit)

First. I give that all my just debts be paid — — —
Item. I send unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Perkins the
Land and Plantation wherein I now live during her
natural life or widowhood, saving and reserving to my
Daughters Elizabeth Perkins, Anna Perkins, Mary Perkins,

Sarah Perkins, Susanna Perkins, and Frances Perkins
Inventories, accounts, and Settlements, and all other rights (in common) in the property

Health & Marriage of my said Wife and Daughters. I give the
same unto my three Sons Zachariah Perkins, John Perkins
and Abram Perkins Equally to them and their Heirs forever.
Item. I leave unto my said Wife all my Negroes, Stock and all
my Personal Estate be it of what kind or Nature it may
during her natural life or widowhood Subjectio as hereafter mentioned
and after her death or marriage I give these said Negroes, Stock and
other Personal Estate with their increase so to be equally Divided
amongst all my Daughters (to wit) Ann Bowles, Elizabeth
Perkins, Anna Perkins, Mary Perkins, Sarah Perkins
Martha Perkins, Susanna Perkins, and Frances Perkins
to them and their Heirs forever.

Item. I give unto my three Sons Zachariah Perkins, John
and Abram Perkins all my Lands lying and being in
the states of North Carolina and Kentucky to be Equally
Divided amongst them, to them and their Heirs forever.

Item. My Will and desire is that all my Daughters that are now
single, shall have a feather Bed and furniture, and a horse
one Saddle to be raised out of my Estate and Delivered unto
them as they Marry.

Item. My will and desire is that my two Sons John Perkins
and Abram Perkins shall have a good Horse and Saddle, as
they come to the age of Eighteen years to be raised out of my
Estate. And lastly I do appoint my friends Stephen Perkins
and Anderson Bowles, and my Son Zachariah Perkins Executors
