 Thus my last Will and Testament -

To the Heirs of the Body of My Sister Ann Porter, I
 give and bequeath the House and Lot situated in the Town of
 Columbus in the County aforesaid wherein James Porter
 and the said Ann his wife now resides and in case the
 said Ann Porter shall die without Issue, then
 the House and Lot aforesaid is to go to her hus-
 band James Porter and his Heirs forever -

I desire that my Brother Nathaniel West Price may
 do release from my Estate the sum of one hundred
 time last year for the Eleven following: Negro slaves (to wit)
 Dolly, John, Sukey, Cammie, Betty, Lucy, Molly, Rozah,
 Jack, Sally & Sandy, - provides he gives up a relinquish-
 ment signed by me for two thousand Dollars of my proportion
 as a Legatee of Meredith Price dec^d of his Estate in the State
 of Kentucky -

To my servant Boy Sam, I give in his left hand by a
 bond in consideration of his Attachment to my self as well
 as to the Family generally, I give and bequeath his freedom
 on the first day of December in the year Eighteen hundred
 and Two and in the mean time he is to remain in the ser-
 vice of my Mother Elizabeth Price -

Whatever Estate I possess either real or personal I
 give and bequeath to my Mother Elizabeth Price except
 such as is herein before disposed of, for and paying her Nat-
 ural dues and as her portion now equally divided among the
 Legatee of my deceased Father Meredith Price.

I do hereby appoint Executors of this my last Will and Testament - Witness my hand and seal this seventeenth day of March one thousand Eight hundred.

I Elias Mills of the County of Fluvanna being aged and weak but of perfect mind and memory do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament and without further preamble I desire all my just Debts to be fairly and honestly paid. Then I give to Molly Napier of the state of Tennessee five Dollars also to Phanny Chism an Heir of this County five dollars. Also to Ann Greenhaw of Williamsburg five dollars. These three having had their portions heretofore. I only mention them with this small sum. My Will and desire is that said Ann Greenhaw & Molly Napier

and all her children be or be to have to have the same for ever also five dollars each

I give and bequeath to my dear friends of country two thousand Dollars of the value now current also all my Negroes viz. Betty, London, Frank, Tom, James, Ben, & Sam, to the said Betty his Heirs or legal representatives for ever I hereby absolve and give him all the Debt he may be owing to me at the time of my death this last legacy not to be liable to any abatement for Debts &c. as long as any other of my Estate remains. I give to Mathew Mills Eight hundred and fifty Dollars to him and his Heirs, then all the residue of my estate of Every kind, to be divided in the following manner between doctor John Mills and his Brother Elias Mills of Amherst, Viz. two thirds to John Mills the other third to Elias Mills, the Reason I give for dividing in this partial manner is to reimburse John Mills John Mills for money he pays Doctor Touchet and has never got the money from A Gilliams Estate. I also give to my friends

my best Bed & furniture, with what Table and Kitchen ^{furniture} there may be in his House at the time of my Death. My desire also is that John Mills may be my Acting Executor I also appoint his Brothers B. D. Mills and Mathew Mills Executors of this my last Will and Testament revoking all other Wills
