I Alexander Pope, Price of the County of Fluvanna in the state of Virginia do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament.

To the Hours of the Body of My Sister Ann Porter I give and bequeath the House and Lot situated in the Town of Columbia in the County aforesaid wherein James Porter and the said Ann his wife now resides and in case the said Ann Porter shall live without Spouse, I desire that House and Lot aforesaid to go to her Husband James Porter and his Heirs forever.

I desire that my Brother Nathaniel West Price may be allowed for his services in the time some time last year for the Eleven following Negro slaves to wit Dolly, Betsy, Suky, Edmund, Billy, Lucy, Molly Rose, Jack, Salley & Sandy, - provided he gives up a relinquishment signed by me for two thousand Dollars of my proportion as a legacy of Meredithe Price, rec^d of his Estate in the state of Kentucky.

To my servant Boy Sam, lame in his left hand by a burn in consideration of his attachment to myself as well as to the family generally, I give and bequeath his freedom on the first day of December in the year Eighteen hundred and Ten, and in the mean time he is to remain in the service of my Mother Elizabeth Price.

Whatever Estate I profess either real or personal I give and bequeath to my Mother Elizabeth Price except such as is herein before disposed of, for and paying her Rent when ages and as the people now equally divided among the children of my second Father Meredithe Price.

hereby acknowledge and give him all the Debt he may be
owing to me at the time of my death this last Legacy not
to liable to any statement for Debts &c. as long as any other
of my Estates remains. I give to Mathew Wills Eight
hundred and fifty Dollars to him and his Heirs. Then all the
residue of my estate of every kind, to be divided in the fo-
llowing manner between Doctor John Wills and his Brother
Elias Wills of Amherst. Viz. two thirds to John Wills the
other third to Elias Wills. the Reason I give for dividing
in this particular manner is to reimburse Doctor Wills John
Wills for money he payes Doctor Touchet and has never got the
money from Dr. Williams Estate. I also give to my Friend
