Such by all persons - After all my lawfull Debts are
 paid (Item) the first - first I lend to my Wife Mary all my
 Estate Real and personal during ^{her} Natural life or widowhood
 Item the 2nd next I give to my Daughter Alice Jarvis one
 Feather Bed and Furniture one cow and one Negro wench
 named Sarah and one Girl named Bet all of which is now
 in her possession -
 Item the 3rd next I give to my Daughter Nancy Jarvis one
 Negro Girl named Mornin, one Feather Bed and Furniture
 and one cow all of which is now in her possession -
 Item the 4th next I lend to my Daughter Susanna Hughes
 (during her Natural life) one Negro wench named Abby, but
 should she die without issue I desire
 'Tis my desire for Abby to obtain her Freedom -
 Item the 5th next I desire that after my departure from
 this life, that a Negro man named Peter (now in the
 Possession of Littleberry Priddey) should be equally divided
 (or his Value) between my three Daughters, Viz; Alice
 Jarvis, Nancy Priddey and Susanna Hughes -
 Item the 6th next I give to my Son John F Hughes all the
 Land I possess on the South side of bunninghams
 creek, being a part of the Tract I now live on to him
 and his Heirs forever -

all the Land on the South side bunninghams creek
 to him and his Heirs forever

Item the 6th near I give to my daughter Sally Hughes one Negro wench named Lucy, and my Negro wench Han should have a child after this Date, in my will that, that also should be lent as above to my daughter Sally Hughes during her Natural life, but if she die without Lawfull issue that both should enjoy their freedom after her death —

Item the 9th near I give to my son John F Hughes a Negro Boy Jack during his Natural life but if John F Hughes die without Lawfull issue, it is my will for Jack to enjoy his freedom after his death —

Item the 10th near I give to my son Anthony Hughes one Negro wench named Han during his Natural life, but if said Anthony should die without Lawfull issue, it is my will that Han should enjoy her freedom after his death

Item the 11th near if said Han should have any more children than is already given, between the date hereof and the death of my Wife it is my will that they should be equally divided between John F Hughes and Anthony Hughes upon the same Terms that the mother is will'd —

Item the 12th near I desire that all my Movable property not heretofore mentioned should be equally divided between Sally Hughes, John F Hughes and Anthony, after my Wife's death. Lastly I do constitute Robert Hunt and John F Hughes my Executors to the above Instrument. Given under my hand and seal this 24th day of June 1779

And on the Motion of Robert Hunt one of the Executors therein named who made oath thereto as the Law directs, and entered into Bond with Samuel Richardson Gentlman in his Security in the Penalty of Five Hundred Dollars conditioned as the Law directs, Certificate is granted him for obtaining a Probate thereof in due form.

Having turned out first in life in the service; and - assistance of my Brother Daniel Rags late of the West Indies, in the Management of his Estates there, and afterwards during the Revolutionary War, removed to Virginia and rendered similar services to my Brother Daniel Rags and the whole prime of my life was zealously
