that the interest of said, Amos. I Amos Litley of
 the county of Fluvanna being of sound mind and memory and calling
 to mind the uncertainty of life do constitute and ordain this to be
 my last Will and Testament in manner and form following - First
 I desire that all my just Debts be paid.

Item I leave unto my beloved Wife Elizabeth Litley three hundred Acres
 of Land it being a part of the Tract whereon I now live including
 the dwelling house and that part of the Plantation during her life,
 also one Negro Man named Daniel and a Negro Boy named Dick
 also one feather bed and furniture also her choice of my Horses, with
 her Saddle and Bridle, also one third part of my Kitchen furniture
 two cows and calves and one third part of my Sheep and Hogs, one
 yoke of Hens and a Cart, Twenty barrels of Corn, Five hundred Weight
 of Pork and a Beef and her choice of one Horse Wheel and one bottom.

Which Item I give unto my son Samuel Litley, one hundred
 Acres of Land it being a part of the Tract of Land whereon I now live
 to be paid of acquiring the Land of William Richardson also one Negro
 Boy named Jesse, one feather Bed and furniture one cow and calf
 the young Saddle Horse and four year's schooling to be paid for out
 of my estate; and at the death of said Wife I give unto my said son
 Samuel the Tract of Land whereon I now live containing four hundred
 Acres to him and his heirs forever together with the above named
 Negroes Daniel and Dick and Jesse with the other property lent to
 my Wife.

Item I give unto my son Amos Litley two hundred Acres of Land
 lying in Fluvanna County in the Byrd Creek, also one Negro Boy
 named Dave.

Item I give unto my son William Litley two hundred Acres of Land

acquiring the above named Amos Litley's Land, also one Negro Boy

named Jesse.

Item I give unto my son John Litley one hundred Acres of Land

In the County of Spotsylvania where the said
 one hundred Acres more lying in the County of Spotsylvania adjoining
 the Lands of David Rife, also one Negro Boy named James
 Now I give unto my son Pleasant Lilly Two hundred Acres of Land
 lying in the County of Spotsylvania adjoining the Lands of David Rife
 also one Negro boy named Isaac also a feather bed and furniture
 Now I give unto my son Robert Lilly the Lands whereon he now
 lives adjoining the Lands of John Richardson containing one hundred
 Acres also one hundred Acres more lying in the County of Spotsylvania
 being a part of the Tract that was divided between my sons
 John Pleasant and said Robert, also one Negro Girl named Jane
 Now I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth Tuggle one Negro Man
 named Ben also a Negro Girl named Melly
 Now I give unto my Daughter Rachel Baskett one Negro Girl
 named Sammy also one Negro Boy named Tom
 Now I give unto my Daughter Anne Barnett a Negro Man
 named Peter also a Negro Woman named Dicy
 Now I give unto my Daughter Mary Lilly one Negro Woman
 named Lucy also one Negro Woman named Syra

All the remainder of my property be it of what kind or nature
 it may be I give it may be unto and the Money arising there-
 from to be equally divided amongst my children hereafter named
 to wit: Elizabeth Tuggle, Anne Barnett, Amiger Lilly Rachel
 Baskett William Lilly Mary Lilly John Lilly Pleasant Lilly
 and Robert Lilly, so as to make each one have an equal por-
 tion including that part of my estate they have already in
 possession which has been hitherto sold for that purpose ex-

cept that part sent to my Wife and after her death

And I am hereby revoking all those by me hitherto made
 In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and after my
 Seal this eleventh day of November one thousand eight hundred and
 two

 obtaining a Probate thereof in due form.
