 Woodson of Fluvanna County being of sound memory at this
 time praise be to God for it and knowing the uncertainty of
 this life do make this my last Will and Testament.
 Dispositio of my Estate in manner following
 I Give I Give to my Daughter Elizabeth Sapier three
 Acres Daniel Selley and Joseph during her natural life
 and after decease to be equally divided between her children
 to them and their heirs forever

I Give I Give and bequeath to my son Benjamin Woodson

Acres of Land in the County of Fluvanna lying on Little
 Long Creek and two Acres Harry & Day to him and his
 heirs forever
 I Give and bequeath to my loving son Paul Woodson
 what I have heretofore given him with the Land I now
 live on after my wife's death or marriage and also
 a Negro boy named Harry — to him & his heirs forever
 I Give to my daughter Elizabeth Sapier one
 hundred Acres of Land during her natural life and after
 her death and after her death I Give the said one hundred
 Acres of Land to her son William Sapier to him & his
 heirs forever I also Give to my daughter Elizabeth three Acres
 Robert Selley and Joseph during her natural life and after
 her decease to be equally divided among her children in
 case between her children forever

I Give I Give to my daughter Selley Williams Bob Selley
 John Selley Tom Charles and John during her natural
 life and after her death to be equally divided between
 her children with their future increase to them and
 their heirs forever

I Give I Give to my Wife Fanny Woodson a Negro
 woman named Betty and her increase during her
 natural life and after her death to be equally divided
 between her children to them and their heirs forever

I Give I Give to my wife & Black house Ten fushu bar &

I also give to my wife the house and land I now live in and
the Negro man named Beham among the remainder my wife
and at her death or marriage the house to my son Bruth
and the Negro Beham to my son William I also give my
wife half the sheep and all my hogs with twenty barrels
of Corn & fowls enough to support her stock for the winter
It is my will and desire that the plantation may not be
rented or leased out

Now I give to my grandson Benjamin Hudson Apau
one Negro man named Dick and my riding horse to him
and his heirs forever all the rest of my Estate is to be
equally divided between my wife and my son William
this being my last will and Testament as Witness my
hand this eight day of October one thousand eight hundred
and seven

Bruth Hudson & Samuel T. Hudson
Executors of this my last will & Testament

I give to my Daughter Betty E. Mason, a plain gold
Ring & not any thing ^{else} she also having received already her
full proportion in. The balance of my Estate of every kind
whatsoever not previously devised I give to my beloved wife
during her natural life and at her ^{last wishes} death to be equally
divided amongst my four sons to wit Benjamin & Stephen
Richard & Joseph John F. Mason & Joseph F. Mason, the
Survivors or their legal representatives.

Lastly I constitute & appoint my ready beloved wife
Elizabeth Executrix & my ^{sons} Benjamin & Stephen
to this my Last Will and Testament they (meaning my sons)
to qualify and act when they arrive to the age of twenty
one years. In Testimony whereof I have subscribed the same
with own hand and caused my name to be witnessed this
ninth day of March eighteen hundred & Eight.
