ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form
as follows (to wit) Item I give and bequeath unto my son
Shadrack Layne one hundred and ten acres of Land lying in
Goodland County, adjoining John Martin being the Land wherein
he now lives - Item I give unto my son Jacob Bradshaw
Layne one hundred acres of land lying over the brick adjoin-
ing Shadrack Walker being the land wherein he now
lives - Item I give and bequeath unto my son Elisha Layne
one hundred and fifty acres of Land being the place
wherein I now live, also one gun and one pair shot
the remaining part of my Estate not already settled
over and give and bequeath one half of the same to my wife

and son Eliza, and the other half I give unto my wife
during her life and at her death I give and bequeath the same
unto my said son Elisha Layne - Item I give unto my other
children (to wit) Samuel Layne, John Layne, Farris Layne,
Lucy Martin, Judith Howard, and Molley Basby one
shilling each - Lastly I constitute nominate and ordain
my son Elisha Layne my Executor to this my last Will
and Testament & also desire there shall be no appraisement

named Reuben Martin should have them. I give and bequeath unto my
Daughter Polly Hickerson, Elizabeth Martin, Reuben Martin their equal propa-
tions in all kinds of Stock not heretofore devised together with all the House
hold and Kitchen furniture. It is my wish that Archibald Martin and
William Huges act as my Executors, ~~I~~ I certify this to be my last Will

the following Negro Slave Sam'l to possess and use during his natural
life and after his death any other slave
Slaves and all his future increase be equally divided between his
