 and lands and all other of my goods and Chattles after the death
 of my now wife I desire to be equally divided betwixt them two
 Brothers by consent. and if not divide the above lands and monies
 and all other of my goods and Chattles as above mentioned one
 half of the value to my Son Tandy Moore and the other half the
 value to my Son Obadiah Moore whom I appoint with his Brother
 Tandy Moore Executors of this my last Will and Testament and
 revoke all other Wills, confirming this and no other to be my
