Nancy Duncan, Polly Duncan, Howell L. Langham Duncan and
Sally Duncan, Children of Mr. Mary Duncan.

Tenthly - all the rest and residue of my Estate of what kind
soever I give and bequeath unto the above named, John Duncan
Howell Lewis Langham Duncan, John Bayton Duncan, Mary
Duncan, Polly Duncan and Sally Duncan to be equally
divided between them.

Lastly, I constitute and appoint John Duncan son of Mr.
Mary Duncan, my Nephew John Bayton of Milton and my
friend John Quarles of Fluvanna Executors to this my last
Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand, this 9th day of October one thousand eight hundred
and one.

In the name of God Amen this 26th day of April 1800. I Hugh Lewis Venable of the County of Fluvanna
being at this time weak in Body but of Sound Mind and Memory
calling to mind the instability of my body, the certainty of death, do
make and ordain this to be my last Will and Testament utterly
disallowing and revoking all all former Wills and Testaments that
I have principally and first I commend my Soul into the
hands of God that gave it and my Body to the Earth to be buried
at the discretion of my Executors, and as touching such worldly estate
wherein it has pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise and
dispose of the same in the following manner and form - Item
it is my Will and desire that my just and Lawfull Debts be paid.

Then I give and bequeath to my Son Nathaniel Venable one hundred
and twenty three Acres of Land adjoining his line and Sandy River
to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Nathaniel Venable one
and eighty Acres of Land whereon I now live to him and his heirs for-
ever. Item I give and bequeath to my son Abraham Venable one
Sorel bolt called his also one feather Bed and furniture to him and
his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my son John
Venable one feather Bed and furniture to him and his heirs for-
ever. Item I will that all my Barthen Ware, Custer and Citchen furniture
should be equally divided between my sons John Venable and Abraham
Venable. Item I will that all and every of my working Tools should be equally
divided between my sons Nathaniel Venable, John Venable and Aba-
ham Venable. Item I will that all the rest of my personal Estate
whatsoever to be equally divided either by sail or by ballot amongst all
my children. Item the two Infants of my Daughter Mary Moore
when deceased to be bound as one ~~Virginia~~

plantation Utensils, Beds and furniture; And at her decease to be
equally divided amongst my Children then living (except the
part of my Land lying on the South side of the Road whereon
I live, and in the ^{North side of the} said Road from the old line upwards I
give unto my sons John and Williamson Hall to be equally
divided between them at my said Wifes decease, And the rest of
my Land whereon I now live the North side of the said Road
whereon my Dwelling House &c is I give unto my son Richard Hall
at my said Wifes decease. Item I give and bequeath unto my
Daughter Nancy Cary one Negro Woman named Mary & a
Negro Boy named Merit to her and heirs forever. I give
unto my son John Hall one Negro Girl named Desha and a Negro

Boy named Lewis to him and his heirs &c I give unto my daughter
Nancy Cary one Negro Girl named Annchen and another Negro

girl named Eliza to her and her heirs forever. I give unto my daughter Elizabeth forty one Negro girl named Amy and a Negro boy named Martin to her and her heirs forever. I give unto my son Richard Hall one Negro girl named Fanny and all the ready money I have (after my Lawful Debts are paid) to him and his heirs forever. I give unto my son William Hall one Negro Woman named Maria and a Negro boy named Jack to him and his heirs forever. My Will and desire is that the money arising from my beque now made be equally divided amongst my living Wife and Children aforesaid. I do hereby appoint my sons, John, Richard and William Hall Executors with my loving Wife Letitia Hall Executrix of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this twenty second Day of November one thousand eight hundred and one.
