mind and memory do hereby make my last Will and Testament in  
manner and form following that is to say  
1<sup>st</sup> I leave unto my beloved Wife Anne Bryant all my estate during  
her natural life: With right and privilege to be by her freely enjoyed  
2<sup>nd</sup> I give to my son John Bryant after the death of my Wife  
the sum of three Dollars and thirty three Cents to be raised out my  
estate by my Executors hereafter to be named  
3<sup>rd</sup> I give to my son David Bryant the sum of three Dollars and thirty  
three Cents to be paid in the same manner as is mentioned in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Clause  
4<sup>th</sup> I give to my son Henry Bryant the sum of three Dollars and thirty three  
Cents to be paid in the same manner as is mentioned in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Clause  
5<sup>th</sup> I give to my son George Bryant the sum of three Dollars and thirty  
three Cents to be paid in the same manner as is mentioned in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Clause  
6<sup>th</sup> I give to my son Thomas Bryant the sum of three Dollars and thirty  
three Cents to be paid in the same manner as is mentioned in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Clause  
7<sup>th</sup> I give to my son William Bryant the sum of three Dollars and thirty  
three Cents to be paid in the same manner as is mentioned in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Clause  
and lastly I give unto my son William Bryant (who I do hereby  
appoint and constitute Executor to this my last Will and Testament) the  
Land whereon I now live with all my other Estates of any kind the  
Book that shall be there on the plantation with every out standing  
debt to him and his heirs forever. It is my Will and desire that my  
Apprenticeship near Inventing be made of my estate after my death  
hereby revoking all former Wills and Testaments by me herebefore made  
This Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed  
my Seal this 5<sup>th</sup> day of July one thousand eight hundred and nine  
Signed sealed published and  
proven in and for the last Will  
and Testament of the above

Not a Grant of Summary Judgment for Henrico County and Henrico  
the 25<sup>th</sup> day of August 1809. This Will was the day received in Court and  
proved by the oath of Anne Bryant (her Wife) and Jonathan Smith  
three of the Magistrates of the County and ordered to be entered in the  
Court of Henrico the Executor thereof named a bond with  
two sureties and entered into and acknowledged "My Seal" and  
two thousand Dollars with the Seal of the Court and the Court  
provisionally confirmed as the last Will and Testament of the  
deceased a Probate thereof in due form
