In the name of God, Amen. Mary of Sixteenth one
thousand seven hundred and Eighty two. I Isaac Knight of Fluvanna
County, being very sick and weak but of perfect mind and
memory thanks be to God for the same, and calling to remembrance

it is appointed for all men once to die. I make and ordain this my last Will
and Testament, first then, I commit my soul into the hands of Almighty
God that gave it; and my body to be buried in a Decent Christian
manner, nothing doubting, but to receive the same again at the
General Resurrection with union of Soul and Body in a glorious Resur-
rection, through the Merits of Jesus Christ my Saviour & Redeemer.

And as touching my worldly goods, wherewith it hath pleased Almighty
God to bestow upon me, far above my deserts, I give, devise, and bequeath
in the following manner and form.

Imprimis - I give and bequeath to my well beloved Wife Anna
Knight one hundred Acres of Land including the Plantation where
this Isaac Knight lives, with all my Stock of every kind, and her
hols Goods and Chattels, during her Natural life, and at the death
of this Anna Knight, the above said her and her heirs to be the
right and property of my son Isaac Knight and his heirs forever.

Now I give to my son Ephraim Knight fifty Acres of Land in-
cluding the Plantation where this Ephraim Knight now
lives, being being part of Tract of Land purchased of Benjamin
man on the West side of the creek called Smiths Creek in Fluvanna
County during his Natural life, and if dying without his begetting
of his Body, lawfully, then said Land to be the right and property of my
Daughter Linnna Knight, during her Natural life, and if this
Linnna Knight dies without him begotten of her Body lawfully, then the said
fifty acres of Land to be sold at public Auction, and the money equally divided
among all my children, namely, Ephraim Knight, Henry Richshaw,
Nancy Knight, Linnna Knight, Elizabeth Knight, Benjamin Knight, and
Isaac Knight, but if either of the two last mentioned Ephraim Knight or
Linnna Knight, shall have an heir lawfully begotten of their Bodies that
fifty Acres of Land to be their right and property, and thine heirs forever.

Item, I give to my son Benjamin Knight fifty acres of land adjoining the five mentioned fifty acres, on the north side, and on the West side of the same mentioned back, of just the quantity on the West side of the back, to be made out on the East side of the back to him and his heirs forever, and if the said Benjamin should die without a lawful ^{him} begotten of his body thereof, fifty acres of land to be the right and property of my son Isaac Knight to him and his heirs forever. I appoint my wife Ann Knight my whole and sole executrix of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above written.
