Bond with William Kirby then Seaway, in the sum of three
thousand Dollars, Conditioned as the law directs, Certificate is
granted them for obtaining a probate thereof in due form.

Knight we In the name of God, Amen. May it please the
thousand seven hundred and eighteen. I, Isaac Knight of Flun-
anna County, being very sick, and weak but of perfect mind and
memory, thanks be to God for the same, and calling to mind

it is appered for all men once to die. I make and ordain this my last Will
and Testament, first thus, I commit my soul into the hands of Almighty God
that gave it; and my body to be buried in a decent Christian
manner, nothing doubting, but to receive the same again at the
General Resurrection with unison of Soul and Body in a glorious vis-
tity, through the Medies of Jesus Christ my Saviour & redeemer.

And as touching my worldly goods wherewithal it hath pleased Almighty
God to bestow upon me, far above my worth, I give, devise, and bequeath
in the following manner and time.

Imprimis - I give and bequeath to my wife before mentioned, Ann
Knight one hundred acres of land in the plantation whereon
she d^r. Isaac Knight lives, with all my Stock of every kind, and there
held Goods and Chattels, during her Natural life, and at the death
of this^d Ann Knight, the above said hundred Acres to be the
right and property of my son Isaac Knight and his heirs forever
whereas, her world Goods and Chattels to be at her disposal.

Item I give to my son Ephraim Knight fifty acres of Land in-
cluding the Plantation wherein this Ephraim Knight formerly
lived, being being part of Land of James purchase of Colvin, a
man in the West side of the Creek called Smith Creek in Flun-
anna County during his Natural life, and of dying without his begetting
of his Body, lawfully, this Land to be the right and property of my
daughter Anna Knight, during her Natural life, and if this
Anna Knight die without her begetting of the Body lawfully, then these
fifty acres of Land to be sold at publick Auction, and the money equally divided
among all my children, namely, Ephraim Knight, Mary Westmore-
land, Nancy Knight, Anna Knight, Elizabeth Knight, Benjamin Knight, and
Lena Knight, but it will be the two last mentioned, Ephraim Knight or
Anna Knight, shall have an her lawfully begetting of their Bodies that
fifty acres of Land to be their right and property, and their heirs forever.

Me, I give to my son Benjamin Knight fifty acres of land adjoining
the five mentioned fifty acres, on the North side, and on the West side of the
aforementioned back, if not the quantity on the West side of the back, to be
made out on the East side of the back to him and his heirs forever and if
the said Benjamin should die without a lawful begotten of his body thousand,
fifty acres of land to be the right and property of my son Isaac Knight
to him and his heirs forever. I appoint my wife Ann Knight my
whole and sole executrix of this my last Will and Testament. In witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand seal the day and year above
written.
