 revoking all former wills by me made in manner and form following
 to wit that I recommend my soul to Almighty God that gave it me
 keeping forever of him for all my offences and to be received into his

grace when time with me is at an end in this life and my body
 buried as my Predecessors heretofore named shall think proper, and as to
 my worldly goods with which it hath pleased god to fitfess me with I
 give and bequeath in manner and form following to wit
 First I bind to my beloved wife Cecily Adams during her natural
 life and no longer four negroes namely Sam, Amy, Frank and one
 also two feather Beds and furniture bedasses and ten head of cattle
 also fifteen head of hogs. Item I give to my son James Adams two
 Negroes namely Brister and sook. Item I give to my son William
 one negroe wench and child Namely Sarah and Harry and the
 tract of Land on which he now lives containing by estimation two
 hundred acres more or less. Item I give to my son
 Robert two negroes Namely web and Harry and the tract on
 which he now lives containing two hundred acres be the same
 more or less. Item I give to my son Thomas one negroe named
 Tom and the land he now possesses of the South side of the river
 containing two hundred and fifty acres be the same more or less.
 Item I give to my son John the land on which he built above
 beginning where the path crosses from my house the rolling back
 from the stone house to son Samuels then up the rolling back
 to where the back road crosses the said back thence down the said
 line towards the river to aline except to its beginning; Item I
 give to my son Richard Adams one Negroe named Toney and
 to hold the tract of land formerly belonging to Charles Daniels
 beginning on the south side of great Michamuck opposite to where

son James now lies thence along to the rising track from the stone
house thence up the said track to whar the line comes from the
creek thence down the creek to its begining Item I give to my
son Charles Adams two negroes namly Will and Tom and
the land on which I now live except my wife Phinda and that
at her death Item I give to my daughter Nancie one negro name
d Panniel Item I give to my Daughter Sallie one negro
named Sal Item I give to my Daughter Millie one negro name
of Lillie man; Item I give to my Daughter Mourning one
negroe named Doritor Item I give to my Daughter with whom
negro namely amis third child Harry my will and desirous
that at my death all the land that is not sold away that
I profess my be sold and all the other property that I'm not sold
and the monie arising thereby be applied to the paying my debts
and if any remain divided equally amongst the girls and my
wife because except by thirds of the land be sold at her death and
the monie arising thereby be equally divided amongst my sons
after my debts being fully satisfied I appoint four of my sons
Executors to this my last will and testament Namly Robert
Adams, Thomas Adams, Richard Adams, and Charles Adams
