 his Will being of sound memory and calling to mind the certainty of
 Death to all do make and declare this my last will and Testament
 revoking all former wills by me made in manner and form following
 to wit that I recommend my soul to Almighty God that ever will be
 hoping pardon of him for all my offences and to be success into his

family when time with me is at an end in this life and my body
 I give as my Executors hereafter named shall think proper, and as to
 my worldly goods with which it hath pleased God to prosper me with
 give and bequeath in manner and form following to wit
 First I lend to my beloved wife Cicely Adams during her natural
 life and no longer four negroes namely Sam, Mary, Frank and man
 also two feather Beds and furniture tea boxes and ten head of cattle
 also fifteen head of hogs. Then I give to my son James Adams two
 Negroes namely Brister and wack. Then I give to my son William
 one negro wench and child Namely Sarah and Henry and the
 track of Land on which he now lives containing by estimation two
 hundred acres more or less. Then I give to my son
 Robert two negroes Namely Jack and Henry and the tract on
 which he now lives containing two hundred acres be the same
 more or less. Then I give to my son Thomas one negro Named
 Isaac and the land he now possesses of the South side of the river
 containing two hundred and fifty acres be the same more or less
 Then I give to my son John the land on which he built a house
 beginning where the path crosses from my house the riding track
 from the Store house to son James thence up the riding track
 to where the backline crosses the waid track thence down the
 line towards the river to a line chopt to its beginning; Then I
 give to my son Richard Adams one Negro Named Toney and
 the tract of Land bounded between him and to Charles Dousless
 beginning on the south side of great Church opposite to where

In James was then thence alone to the riding track from the other
 have thence up the said track to where the line comes from the
 creek thence down the creek to its beginning Item I give to my
 son Charles Adams two Negroes namely Will and Tony and
 the land on which I now live except my wife Rhonda and that
 at her death Item I give to my daughter Nance one negro nam-
 ed Daniel Item I give to my Daughter Sallie one negro
 named Sal Item I give to my Daughter Mitty one negro name
 ly Little nan Item I give to my Daughter Mourning one
 negro named Drister Item I give to my Daughter Sallie one
 negro namely Annies third child Tony my will and desires
 that at my death all the land that is not wiled away that
 I possess my be sold and all the other property that I now have
 and the money arising thereby be converted to the paying my debts
 and if any remains divided equally amongst the girls and my
 wife's legasse except her thirds of the land be sold at her death and
 the money arising thereby be Equally divided amongst my sons
 after my debts being fully satisfied I appoint four of my sons
 Executors to this my last will and testament Namely Robert
 Adams Thomas Adams, Richard Adams, and Charles Adams
 Signed, Sealed and acknowledged } James Adams.

At a Court continued and held for Newanna County
 on Tuesday the 3rd day of April 1789.

This Will was then due testimony in Court with the last will
 and Testament of James Adams deceased and sundry witnesses

and examined to the hand Writing of the said James Adams it ap-
 pears to this Court that the said Will was really written by the said
 Testator himself and ordered that the same be recorded, and at
 a Court held for this County the first day of October in the year
 aforesaid, On the motion of Thomas Adams and Robert Adams
 two of the Executors named in this Will who made oath to the same
 and Entered into Bond with W^m Adams, Charles Adams, Richard
 Adams Securities in the penalty of fifteen hundred pounds each
 licensed as the Law directs. Certificate is granted them for obtaining
 a probate thereof in due form.
