

At a Court of Quarterly Sessions held for the County of Fairfax on Monday the 23rd day of November 1818. This Inventory and appraisement of the Personal estate of John Wolfe deceased was this day examined and found to be correct.

John Wolfe

In the name of God Amen I James Wolfe of the County of Fairfax being in a low state of health tho of perfect sound mind and memory and well knowing that it is once appointed for all to die do hereby make and ordain this my last will and Testament revoking all others antecedent to the date of this after recommending my immortal soul to the great Creator who gives it birth my earthly will and desire is that after all my just debts and funeral expenses are paid the residue or maindors of my estate be disposed of as follows Viz. First my will and desire is that my negro man Dick shall live with my son William J. Wolfe with a request that he will treat him mercifully and well during his life provided my said son William should see before the said negro Dick my desire is then the said Dick shall have it in his power to make choice of living with either of my other children at his own discretion. Secondly the money which I borrowed of my late son George Wolfe late & William J. Wolfe the sum of one hundred dollars of the said George for which I gave a Bond put in a State warehouse and tiller and the money of two hundred dollars of the said George which I received my bond for my wife and I have in hand and I have paid out as much of my said money as I have received of the said George

to be equally divided by a Sale of all my Personal estate in a Court of Justice among all my children in their several shares Viz. Elizabeth D. Oglesby, Priscilla Cole, Lucy M. Cole, Frances Catharine, Isaac Cole the infant daughter of the deceased formerly Jane (Cole) Pamela & Richard Matthews the children of Colley (Cole) and formerly Colley (Cole) and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint William J. Cole, George H. Hays, Thomas Rankin and Walter Richer my Executors to this my last will and Testament. In Witness my hand & seal this 2nd day of March 1818.

At a Court of Quarterly Sessions held for the County of Fairfax on Monday the 23rd day of November 1818. This Will was this day presented in Court and proved by the oath of William J. Wolfe son of John Wolfe and John Johnson to three of the Justices thereof and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of Barnett & Payne one of the Attorneys therein named was ordered to take bonds as the Law directs and interdicts and acknowledged bond in the penalty of Three thousand dollars with William J. Wolfe (his security) conditioned as the Law directs and interdicts is granted him for obtaining a probate thereof in due form and time is allowed the Officers therein named to qualify thereto.
